| <b>HB 52</b>  | <b>ODINET</b>           | <b>TAX EXEMPTIONS/HOMESTEAD</b> (Constitutional Amendment) Removes the prohibition that persons aged sixty-five and older whose adjusted gross income exceeds fifty thousand dollars, as adjusted annually by the Consumer Price Index, cannot receive a special assessment of residential property     |
| <b>HB 65</b>  | <b>MONTGOMERY (TBA)</b> | <b>BONDS</b> Prohibits State Bond Commission approval of industrial revenue and other bonds by certain entities authorized to issue industrial revenue bonds unless first approved by local governmental entities in Bossier Parish affected by the bond issuance ( <b>Subject to Rule Suspension</b> ) |
| <b>HB 68</b>  | <b>CROWE</b>            | <b>TAX/AD VALOREM-EXEMPTION</b> (Constitutional Amendment) Exempts disabled persons from ad valorem tax   |
| <b>HB 173</b> | <b>BURNS</b>            | <b>TAX/AD VALOREM TAX</b> (Constitutional Amendment) Provides for changes in the special assessment level, the millage roll forward by the governing authority and for the legislature's ability to postpone the payment of taxes   |
| <b>HB 187</b> | <b>ARNOLD</b>           | <b>TAX/AD VALOREM-EXEMPTION</b> (Constitutional Amendment) Removes prohibition against extending exemption for motor vehicles to municipal taxes  |
| <b>HB 248</b> | <b>BRUNEAU</b>          | <b>TAX/AD VALOREM TAX</b> (Constitutional Amendment) Provides for a limitation on the increase in assessed value of property pursuant to a reappraisal  |
| <b>HB 273</b> | <b>ARNOLD</b>           | <b>TAX/AD VALOREM TAX</b> (Constitutional Amendment) Limits increases in millages after reappraisal   |
| <b>HB 274</b> | <b>ARNOLD</b>           | <b>TAX/AD VALOREM TAX</b> Limits increases of ad valorem tax millages   |
| <b>HB 335</b> | <b>SCHNEIDER</b>        | <b>TAX/AD VALOREM TAX</b> (Constitutional Amendment) Removes authorization for increase in millages after reappraisal by 2/3 vote of the taxing authority   |
| <b>HB 342</b> | <b>GALLOT</b>           | <b>TAX/AD VALOREM TAX</b> Prohibits certain machinery and equipment from definition of motor vehicles for the purpose of applying the exemption from ad valorem taxation  |
| <b>HB 370</b> | <b>FAUCHEUX</b>         | <b>ASSESSORS/PROPERTY ASSMT</b> (Constitutional Amendment) Freezes the tax assessment of the homestead of a person who is designated as disabled by the U.S. Social Security Administration   |

<b>HB 404</b>	<b>GUILLORY, E.</b>	<b>TAX/AD VALOREM TAX</b> Allow for the payment of ad valorem taxes over a ten-month period
<b>HB 411</b>	<b>CROWE</b>	<b>TAX/AD VALOREM-EXEMPTION</b> Exempts certain property of disabled persons from ad valorem taxes by freezing the assessment level
<b>HB 419</b>	<b>CARTER, K.</b>	<b>TAX/AD VALOREM-EXEMPTION</b> (Constitutional Amendment) Exempts from property tax works of art on consignment
<b>HB 442</b>	<b>CROWE</b>	<b>TAX/AD VALOREM TAX</b> (Constitutional Amendment) Requires unanimous approval of taxing authority for roll forward of ad valorem taxes, except ad valorem taxes dedicated for fire protection and law enforcement
<b>HB 466</b>	<b>BURNS</b>	<b>TAX/AD VALOREM TAX</b> (Constitutional Amendment) Provides for changes in the special assessment level
<b>HB 487</b>	<b>BURNS</b>	<b>TAX/AD VALOREM TAX</b> (Constitutional Amendment) Provides for changes in the special assessment level
<b>HB 501</b>	<b>MARTINY</b>	<b>TAX/AD VALOREM TAX</b> Provides relative to the exemption from ad valorem taxation for certain public property
<b>HB 527</b>	<b>JEFFERSON</b>	<b>TAX/AD VALOREM-MFG/EXEMP</b> (Constitutional Amendment) Provides that any manufacturing establishment receiving an exemption from ad valorem taxes for such taxes levied by a school board shall by terms of the contract granting such exemption be required to make a payment in lieu of any such taxes
<b>HB 539</b>	<b>STRAIN</b>	<b>TAX/AD VALOREM TAX</b> (Constitutional Amendment) Provides that millages can only be rolled forward after a reappraisal by the taxing authority by the increase in the CPI since the previous reappraisal
<b>HB 555</b>	<b>ODINET</b>	<b>TAX/AD VALOREM TAX</b> (Constitutional Amendment) Provides for a limitation on the increase in assessed value of property pursuant to a reappraisal
<b>HB 557</b>	<b>ALARIO</b>	<b>TAX/AD VALOREM TAX</b> (Constitutional Amendment) Removes the authority of the taxing authority to roll forward ad valorem tax millage rates after a reappraisal
<b>HB 582</b>	<b>ALARIO</b>	<b>TAX/AD VALOREM TAX</b> (Constitutional Amendment) Increases the homestead exemption of \$15,000 of assessed valuation
<b>HB 583</b>	<b>ALARIO</b>	<b>TAX/AD VALOREM TAX</b> (Constitutional Amendment) Increases the homestead exemption in accordance with increases in the Consumer Price Index
<b>HB 585</b>	<b>ALARIO</b>	<b>TAX/AD VALOREM TAX</b> (Constitutional Amendment) Limits increase of the assessed value of real property at reappraisal
<b>HB 712</b>	<b>ALARIO</b>	<b>TAX/AD VALOREM TAX</b> Removes the ability of the taxing authority to roll forward ad valorem tax millage rates after a reappraisal
<b>HB 748</b>	<b>ALARIO</b>	<b>TAX/AD VALOREM TAX</b> Changes date for inspection of assessment rolls
