(3) No photos or films of a party shall be introduced as impeachment evidence unless all photos or films of the party in the possession of the presenting party are made available to the court and the opposing counsel immediately following the presentation of the photo or film impeachment evidence.

(4) In the event that surveillance evidence is intended to be used by a party, the party shall notify the court upon the conclusion of testimony by the person sought to be impeached that surveillance evidence will be offered to impeach the testifying party. Upon such notification, the court shall order the disclosure of the evidence and shall afford a reasonable opportunity for the testifying party to review the evidence and offer rebuttal to the surveillance evidence.

(5) For purposes of this Section, "impeachment evidence" shall be that evidence which questions the credibility or accuracy of a party, witness, or other piece of evidence. When evidence sought to be classified as impeachment evidence is not classified as such by the hearing officer, it shall not be admissible unless it is listed on the pretrial order.

B. Any person against whom such an order is issued, shall be entitled to a court-appointed attorney if the applicant has likewise been afforded counsel at no cost, which right shall also be included in any order or notice.
