AMENDMENT NO. 9

On page 2, line 6, after "institution" delete the remainder of the line and insert the following:

"for a specific period of time as determined by the court. If the hazing results in the serious bodily injury or death of the victim, or results in the victim having a blood alcohol concentration of at least .25 percent by weight based on grams of alcohol per one hundred cubic centimeters of blood, the period of time shall be for not less than four years."

AMENDMENT NO. 10

On page 3, line 5, after "normal" delete the remainder of the line, insert a comma ",₂" and insert the following:

"customary, and necessary for a person's training and participation in an athletic, physical"

AMENDMENT NO. 11

""Organization" includes the national or parent organization of which any of the underlying entities provided for in this Paragraph is a sanctioned or recognized member at the time of the hazing."

A. Encroachments, other than those provided in Section R.S. 41:1702, may be permitted and licensed by the ~~department~~ division under the provisions of this Chapter.

B. ~~As provided herein, the State Land Office~~ The office, with the aid of ~~the division~~, the Department of Natural Resources, the Department of Wildlife and Fisheries, the Department of Transportation and Development, and the attorney general, shall adopt regulations to implement this Chapter, including the granting and revoking of permits, leases or licenses, processing of applications, establishing fee schedules, collecting of fees or revenues for all manner of encroachments, and shall create an overall and comprehensive plan for the orderly development and preservation of state lands so as to ensure maximum benefit and use, all in accordance with the law. Further, the fund shall also consist of any other monies appropriated, allocated, or transferred to the fund. Monies in the fund shall be invested in the same manner as monies in the state general fund. Interest earned on investment of monies in the fund shall be credited to the fund. Unexpended and unencumbered monies in the fund at the end of the fiscal year shall remain in the fund.

On the effective date of this Act, the state treasurer shall transfer all monies in the Community Water Enrichment Fund at the close of the prior business day for a one-time deposit and credit to the Water System Enrichment Account within the Community Water Enrichment and Other Improvements Fund."
