RULE 6.8(A) REPORT

OF THE HOUSE COMMITTEE ON CIVIL LAW AND PROCEDURE ON HOUSE BILL NO. 203

April 3, 2018

I. SUMMARY OF JOINT RESOLUTION

This report is for House Bill No. 203 of the 2018 Regular Session by Representative Jackson, proposing to amend Article V, Section 23 and to add Article IX, Section 31 of the Constitution.

HB 203 provides relative to the age of mandatory retirement for judges and provides that no person shall be prohibited from holding public office or employment based solely on age.

II. CONCLUSION

The proposed measure removing the mandatory age of retirement for judges cannot be accomplished statutorily, but the portion of the measure providing that no person shall be prohibited from holding public office or employment based solely on age could be accomplished statutorily.

HB 203 proposes to remove the mandatory age for retirement of judges, which is currently seventy years of age. Since the age for retirement of judges is established by the constitution, the proposed changes can only be accomplished through an amendment to the constitution.
