(6) Notwithstanding any other provision of this Section, any post-mortem forensic medical examination report used in the investigation of any criminal activity or death of any person in the custody or control of any law enforcement or corrections entity authorized by the constitution and laws of the United States or the state of Louisiana are public records subject to the provisions of R.S. 44:3(A)(1)."
