## 2007 Governor's and Legislative Election for the Proposed District

Amd # 2549-151  
to HB 1

### In 2007 Primary:

9,984 voters turned out  
Of that 4693 were black - 47%  
5291 were white or other - 53%

### With regards to 2007 Primary Turnout

Black turnout was 35%  
White turnout was 46%  
There was an 11 point turnout differential

### Runoff (In the 2007 General Election)

2742 voters turned out  
802 were black - 29%  
1905 were white - 71%

### Turnout (With regard to Runoff General Election)

Black turnout was 6%  
White turnout was 17%  
An 11 point turnout differential

### New District added precincts:

While it only represents 36% of the proposed district population, in 2007 primary it represented 44% of the electorate. In the 2007 runoff it represented 67% of the electorate.

The proposed amendment to add population south of Bert Kouns Loop will almost insure in a normal election turnout that a non minority could be elected.

In 2011 where the circumstances appear to be shaping up to be very similar, appeared to me to be a bad idea to split district 3 into two.
