HB 190	MARTINY	<b>WEAPONS/FIREARMS</b> Provides circumstances when local government can enact ordinances more restrictive than state statutes regarding storage of firearms
HB 238	HAMMETT	<b>TRESPASS</b> Provides for an exception relative to criminal trespass for professional land surveyors
HB 254	CROWE	<b>CRIME</b> Provides relative to video games containing material harmful to minors
HB 421	BURRELL	<b>CRIME</b> Provides relative to video games harmful to minors
HB 522	FARRAR	<b>CRIMINAL/BAIL</b> Provides for the abandonment of enforcement and collection of judgments involving a bond forfeiture
HB 526	FARRAR	<b>CRIMINAL/BAIL</b> Provides for the qualifications of personal sureties in bail undertakings
HB 527	MARTINY	<b>CRIMINAL/PROCEDURE</b> Provides for the delays for forfeiture and collection of appearance bonds
HB 784	MARTINY	<b>BONDS/BAIL</b> Provides with respect to bail bond contracts during times of emergency or disaster
HB 817	HOPKINS (TBA)	<b>GAMBLING/VIDEO POKER</b> Provides with respect to promotions at video draw poker establishments. ( <b>Subject to Rule Suspension</b> )
HB 1192	THOMPSON	<b>PARDON/PAROLE</b> Creates a pilot special needs parole program within the Department of Public Safety and Corrections
HB 1199	CROWE	<b>CRIME/SEX OFFENSES</b> Provides for registration of sex offenders ten days prior to release from confinement
HB 1290	WOOTON	<b>CORRECTIONS</b> Provides with respect to housing inmates pending competency hearings
SCR 17	MURRAY	<b>LAW ENFORCEMENT</b> Directs law enforcement agencies within the metropolitan New Orleans area that seized firearms lawfully in the possession of citizens during the hurricane to develop and implement a plan for the return of such firearms to the owners.
SCR 33	MURRAY	<b>GAMING</b> Amends a video poker licensing rule to permit the return of a license surrendered as the result of

hurricane damage after the elapse of 180 days.

SB 2	GAUTREAUX, N.	<b>SEX OFFENSES</b> Increases certain criminal penalties for sexual crimes and offenses involving juveniles under the age of thirteen.
SB 85	JONES	<b>CORRECTIONAL FACILITIES</b> Creates community resource centers to provide for inmates to assist with disaster and emergency relief.
SB 129	JONES (TBA)	<b>CRIMINAL JUSTICE</b> Modifies the rate at which good time can be earned from 30 days for every 30 days served to 35 days for every 30 days served for eligible offenders and to three days for every 17 served for inmates convicted of rape of a victim under 13, aggravated incest, or molestation of a juvenile. ( <b>Subject to Rule Suspension</b> )
SB 180	JONES	<b>CRIME/PUNISHMENT</b> Mandates a ninety-day incarceration limit for the first revocation of probation for a technical violation unless waived by the offender.
SB 228	JONES	<b>CRIMINAL PROCEDURE</b> Provides for suspension of sentence and probation for certain offenders who enter and complete an approved drug program.
SB 253	GAUTREAUX, N.	<b>CRIME/PUNISHMENT</b> Increases the child's age requirement for aggravated kidnapping of a child.
SB 289	FIELDS	<b>PROBATION/PAROLE</b> Authorizes medical parole for inmates who are terminally ill or permanently incapacitated, including those serving sentences for 1 <sup>st</sup> or 2 <sup>nd</sup> degree murder, upon concurrence of the prosecuting D.A.
SB 477	CAIN	<b>CRIMINAL PROCEDURE</b> Provides with respect to the expiration of bail bonds when the time limit for prosecution has lapsed. (gov sig)
SB 547	MURRAY	<b>PARDONS</b> Enacts the Avery C. Alexander Act. (gov sig)
SB 566	CHAISSON	<b>CRIMINAL PROCEDURE</b> Provides with respect to bail bond contracts during times of emergency or disaster. (gov sig)
