HB 295	ROMERO	HEALTH Requires that proof of COVID-19 antibodies be treated and recognized as being vaccinated
 HB 354	HODGES	PUBLIC HEALTH Prohibits local governmental subdivisions from requiring proof of medical status as a condition of participating in a constitutionally protected activity
НВ 396	AMEDEE	SNAP/FOOD STAMPS Provides relative to work requirements within the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program
HB 407	AMEDEE	VACCINES/VACCINATION Prohibits adding any vaccine with emergency use authorization status to the list of vaccinations required for school and child daycare entry

HCR 3	BAGLEY	VACCINES/VACCINATION Repeals administrative rules of the La. Department of Health adding COVID vaccines to the state immunization schedule and requiring schools to prohibit in-person attendance by certain unvaccinated students

Any person who files a prepared statement which contains data or statistical information shall include in such prepared statement sufficient information to identify the source of the data or statistical information. For the purposes of this Paragraph, the term "source" shall mean a publication, website, person, or other source from which the data or statistical information contained in the prepared statement was obtained by the person or persons who prepared the statement.
