HB 321	WYBLE	<b>TEACHERS</b> Provides for teacher certification and professional development with respect to numeracy
HB 352	LARVADAIN	<b>EARLY CHILDHOOD</b> Provides relative to background checks for certain early childhood workers
HB 378	WILDER	<b>TOPS</b> Lowers the ACT score required for initial qualification for a Taylor Opportunity Program for Students award for students who complete approved home study programs
HB 395	BRASS	<b>HIGHER EDUCATION</b> Expands eligible programs for M.J. Foster Promise Program funding to include those associated with LED projects

HB 466	CARLSON	<b>TEACHERS/SALARY</b> Requires school systems to provide a salary increase for teachers and other school employees using savings attributable to the state's payment of certain unfunded accrued liability of the Teachers' Retirement System of Louisiana
HB 558	DAVIS	<b>HIGHER EDUCATION</b> Provides relative to initial eligibility requirements for the M.J. Foster Promise Program
HB 589	OWEN, CHARLES	<b>EDUCATION</b> Provides relative to the effectiveness of laws requiring reports to be submitted annually to the legislature by the State Board of Elementary and Secondary Education and the state Department of Education and provides relative to certain commissions and advisory councils
