<b>HB 37</b>	<b>OWEN, CHARLES</b>	<b>PROPERTY/EXPROPRIATION</b> Prohibits foreign entities from conducting expropriation activities
<b>HB 51</b>	<b>VILLIO</b>	<b>BAIL</b> (Constitutional Amendment) Restricts post-conviction bail for certain offenders
<b>HB 173</b>	<b>BAMBURG</b>	<b>CIVIL/DAMAGES</b> Provides relative to uninsured motorist recovery limitations
<b>HB 192</b>	<b>OWEN, CHARLES</b>	<b>PROPERTY/EXPROPRIATION</b> (Constitutional Amendment) Prohibits expropriation of property by foreign adversaries
<b>HB 306</b>	<b>EDMONSTON</b>	<b>DOMESTIC ABUSE</b> Provides relative to court costs and fees in domestic abuse cases
<b>HB 366</b>	<b>EDMONSTON</b>	<b>DOMESTIC ABUSE</b> Provides relative to continuance of hearings in domestic abuse matters
<b>HB 393</b>	<b>FONTENOT</b>	<b>ELECTIONS/BOND &amp; TAX</b> (Constitutional Amendment) Provides for eligible election dates for bond and tax elections
<b>HB 485</b>	<b>AMEDEE</b>	<b>FAMILY LAW</b> (Constitutional Amendment) Provides relative to parental rights
<b>HB 516</b>	<b>CARTER, WILFORD</b>	<b>CIVIL/DAMAGES</b> Provides relative to recovery limitations for failure to maintain compulsory motor vehicle liability security
<b>HB 521</b>	<b>WILDER</b>	<b>TAX/AD VALOREM TAX</b> (Constitutional Amendment) Authorizes a taxing authority to levy a millage at a rate lower than the maximum authorized rate under certain circumstances
<b>HB 526</b>	<b>DICKERSON</b>	<b>CIVIL/DAMAGES</b> Provides limitations relative to claims for general damages
<b>HB 638</b>	<b>LANDRY, JACOB</b>	<b>CONTRACTORS</b> Provides relative to payments to contractors and subcontractors
<b>HB 817</b>	<b>MCKIN</b>	<b>PROPERTY/IMMOVABLE</b> Establishes the Louisiana Homeowner Bill of Rights
<b>HB 976</b>	<b>TAYLOR</b>	<b>LIABILITY/CIVIL</b> Creates liability for recklessly throwing from a parade float

**HB 1006**      **CARTER, WILFORD**      **CIVIL/PROCEDURE** Extends the time delay for filing of oppositions to motions for summary judgment

Any interested person or any committee member may file with the committee a prepared statement concerning a specific instrument or matter under consideration by the committee or concerning any matter within the committee's scope of authority, and the committee records shall reflect receipt of such statement and the date and time thereof.
