Representative Henry presented House Bill No. 1, which provided for the ordinary operating expenses of state government for FY17-18.

Representative Leger offered a set of amendments. (See Exhibit E) He also offered a motion to adopt the amendments, to which Representative Smith objected. The amendments were adopted by a vote of 16 yeas and 4 nays. Representatives Henry, Abraham, Amedée, Bacala, Billiot, Edmonds, Foil, Harris, Hensgens, Hodges, McFarland, Miguez, Richard, Schroder, Simon, and Zeringue voted yea. Representatives Carter, Leger, Miller, and Smith voted nay.

# **House Bill No. 5 by Representative Henry**

Representative Henry offered a set of amendments to increase and decrease appropriations from fees and self-generated revenues and statutory dedications, and to increase interagency transfers out of the Capital Outlay Act. He also offered a motion to adopt the amendments. Without objection, the amendments were adopted by a vote of 21 yeas and 0 nays. Representatives Henry, Abraham, Amedée, Bacala, Billiot, Carter, Chaney, Edmonds, Foil, Harris, Hensgens, Hodges, Leger, McFarland, Miguez, Miller, Richard, Schroder, Simon, Smith, and Zeringue voted yea.

There was no further discussion on the bill.

Representative Foil offered a motion to report House Bill No. 5 with amendments. Without objection, House Bill No. 5 was reported with amendments by a vote of 21 yeas and 0 nays. Representatives Billiot, Carter, Chaney, Leger, Miller, Smith, and Zeringue voted nay.
