### III. DISCUSSION OF LEGISLATION

## **House Bill No. 5 by Representative Marino**

Representative Marino presented House Bill No. 5, which provides for the emergency suspension of time limitations in certain civil proceedings.

There was no further discussion on House Bill No. 5.

Representative Jenkins offered a motion to report House Bill No. 5 favorably. Without objection, House Bill No. 5 was reported favorably by a vote of 11 yeas, 0 nays, and 1 abstention. Representatives Amedee, Wilford Carter, Frieman, Jefferson, Jenkins, Mike Johnson, Landry, Muscarello, Nelson, Pressly, and Seabaugh voted yea. Representative Gregory Miller abstained.

## House Concurrent Resolution No. 4 by Representative Seabaugh

Representative Seabaugh presented House Concurrent Resolution No. 4, which suspends provisions of law relative to recoverable medical expenses.

Representative Mike Johnson offered a motion to report House Concurrent Resolution No. 4 favorably. Without objection, House Concurrent Resolution No. 4 was reported favorably by a vote of 11 yeas, 0 nays, and 1 abstention. Representatives Amedee, Wilford Carter, Frieman, Jefferson, Jenkins, Mike Johnson, Landry, Muscarello, Nelson, Pressly, and Seabaugh voted yea. Representative Gregory Miller abstained.

# House Bill No. 42 by Representative Gregory Miller

Representative Gregory Miller presented House Bill No. 42, which enacts the Omnibus Premium Reduction Act of 2020.

Representative Gregory Miller offered a technical amendment to correct a citation. Representative Gregory Miller offered a motion to adopt the proposed amendment. Without objection, the amendment was adopted by a vote of 11 yeas, 0 nays, and 1 abstention. Representatives Amedee, Wilford Carter, Frieman, Jefferson, Jenkins, Mike Johnson, Landry, Muscarello, Nelson, Pressly, and Seabaugh voted yea. Representative Gregory Miller abstained.

Representative Gregory Miller offered an amendment to provide that evidence of the existence of applicable liability insurance coverage shall be admissible in any action brought against the insured or insurer and not with limitation to direct actions alone. Representative Gregory Miller offered a motion to adopt the proposed amendment. Without objection, the amendment was adopted by a vote of 11 yeas, 0 nays, and 1 abstention. Representatives Amedee, Wilford Carter, Frieman, Jefferson, Jenkins, Mike Johnson, Landry, Muscarello, Nelson, Pressly, and Seabaugh voted yea. Representative Gregory Miller abstained.

Representative Gregory Miller offered an amendment to reinstate present law allowing for a direct action against the insurer for policies issued out of state or that include provisions forbidding a direct action. Representative Gregory Miller offered a motion to adopt the proposed amendment. Without objection, the amendment was adopted by a vote of 11 yeas, 0 nays, and 1 abstention. Representatives Amedee, Wilford Carter, Frieman, Jefferson, Jenkins, Mike Johnson, Landry, Muscarello, Nelson, Pressly, and Seabaugh voted yea. Representative Gregory Miller abstained.

Representatives Amedee, Wilford Carter, DeVillier, Echols, Frieman, Jefferson, Jenkins, Mike Johnson, Landry, Muscarello, Nelson, Pressly, and Seabaugh voted yea. Representative Gregory Miller abstained.

Representative Echols offered a motion to report House Bill No. 44 with amendments, to which Representative Jenkins objected. The administrative assistant called the roll, and House Bill No. 44 was reported with amendments by a vote of 9 yeas, 4 nays, and 1 abstention. Representatives Amedee, DeVillier, Echols, Frieman, Mike Johnson, Muscarello, Nelson, Pressly, and Seabaugh voted yea. Representatives Wilford Carter, Jefferson, Jenkins, and Landry voted nay. Representative Gregory Miller abstained.
