III. DISCUSSION OF LEGISLATION

House Concurrent Resolution No. 22 by Representative Deshotel

Representative Deshotel presented House Concurrent Resolution No. 22, which urges and requests the House Committee on Commerce and the Senate Committee on Commerce, Consumer Protection, and International Affairs to study the effects that the railroads have on broadband deployment.

Mr. Carmack M. Blackman, Louisiana Railroads, P.O. Box 44035, Baton Rouge, LA 70804, (225) 389-9878, spoke in opposition to House Concurrent Resolution No. 22.

Representative Davis offered a motion to voluntarily defer action on House Concurrent Resolution No. 22. Without objection, action on House Concurrent Resolution No. 22 was voluntarily deferred by a vote of 11 yeas and 0 nays. Representatives Davis, Hilferty, Duplessis, Fontenot, Goudeau, Jordan, McKnight, Newell, St. Blanc, Thomas, and Villio voted yea.

Senate Bill No. 10 by Senator Mizell

Senator Mizell presented Senate Bill No. 10, which provides relative to rural broadband high-speed internet access.

Representative Davis offered amendments to codify a provision of federal law, which allows a cooperative to deny a broadband affiliate or service provider access to its equipment in certain circumstances, in proposed law.

Representative Davis offered a motion to adopt the proposed amendments. Without objection, the amendments were adopted by a vote of 11 yeas and 0 nays. Representatives Davis, Hilferty, Duplessis, Fontenot, Goudeau, Jordan, McKnight, Newell, St. Blanc, Thomas, and Villio voted yea.

Representative Thomas offered a motion to report Senate Bill No. 10 with amendments. Without objection, Senate Bill No. 10 was reported with amendments by a vote of 11 yeas and 0 nays. Representatives Davis, Hilferty, Duplessis, Fontenot, Goudeau, Jordan, McKnight, Newell, St. Blanc, Thomas, and Villio voted yea.
