#### **III. DISCUSSION OF LEGISLATION**

#### House Bill No. 91 by Representative Muscarello

Representative Muscarello presented House Bill No. 91, which provides relative to testimony presented by audio-visual means.

Judge Scott Schlegel, Louisiana District Judges Association, no address provided, (504) 577-0003, spoke for information only on House Bill No. 91.

Representative Muscarello offered a motion to report House Bill No. 91 favorably. Without objection, House Bill No. 91 was reported favorably by a vote of 11 yeas, 0 nays, and 1 abstention. Representatives Amedee, Boyd, Brown, Echols, Frieman, Jefferson, Jenkins, Mike Johnson, Muscarello, Nelson, and Seabaugh voted yea. Representative Gregory Miller abstained.

#### House Bill No. 124 by Representative Muscarello

Representative Muscarello presented House Bill No. 124, which provides relative to certain judicial proceedings conducted by audio-visual means.

Representative Muscarello offered a motion to report House Bill No. 124 favorably. Without objection, House Bill No. 124 was reported favorably by a vote of 12 yeas, 0 nays, and 1 abstention. Representatives Amedee, Boyd, Brown, Echols, Frieman, Jefferson, Jenkins, Mike Johnson, McCormick, Muscarello, Nelson, and Seabaugh voted yea. Representative Gregory Miller abstained.

#### House Bill No. 644 by Representative Green

Representative Green presented House Bill No. 644, which provides relative to legislative continuances or extensions.

On behalf of the author, Representative Frieman offered an amendment to provide that the motion for continuance or extension of time shall be available for events in connection with the legislator's role as a legislator for which he is eligible to receive a per diem. Representative Frieman offered a motion to adopt the proposed amendment. Without objection, the amendments were adopted by a vote of 12 yeas, 0 nays, and 1 abstention. Representatives Amedee, Boyd, Brown, Echols, Frieman, Jefferson, Jenkins, Mike Johnson, McCormick, Muscarello, Nelson, and Seabaugh voted yea. Representative Gregory Miller abstained.

Representative Frieman offered amendments to:

- (1) Provide that the peremptory grounds for continuance or extension of time is applicable to Public Service Commission members or employees and Board of Elementary and Secondary Education members or employees.
- (2) Remove references limiting the motion for continuance or extension of time to just legislative members and employees and adds public representatives of the Public Service Commission and Board of Elementary and Secondary Education members and employees.
- (3) Make technical changes.

Representative Frieman offered a motion to adopt the proposed amendments. Without objection, the amendments were adopted by a vote of 13 yeas, 0 nays, and 1 abstention. Representatives Amedee, Boyd, Brown, Echols, Frieman, Garofalo, Jefferson, Jenkins, Mike Johnson, McCormick, Muscarello, Nelson, and Seabaugh voted yea. Representative Gregory Miller abstained.

Representative Seabaugh offered amendments to:

- (1) Provide that if a legal deadline has run, a motion to continue or extend a legal deadline shall be timely if filed within five days prior to a hearing or proceeding on a motion for sanctions or penalties brought by opposing counsel for failure to comply with the legal deadline.
- (2) Remove prohibition of continuance or extension of time from cases in the Supreme Court of Louisiana.
- (3) Make technical changes.

Representative Seabaugh offered a motion to adopt the proposed amendments. Without objection, the amendments were adopted by a vote of 13 yeas, 0 nays, and 1 abstention. Representatives Amedee, Boyd, Brown, Echols, Frieman, Garofalo, Jefferson, Jenkins, Mike Johnson, McCormick, Muscarello, Nelson, and Seabaugh voted yea. Representative Gregory Miller abstained.

At the request of the author, Representative Gregory Miller offered a motion to voluntarily defer action on House Bill No. 644. Without objection, action on House Bill No. 644 was voluntarily deferred by a vote of 13 yeas, 0 nays, and 1 abstention. Representatives Amedee, Boyd, Brown, Echols, Frieman, Garofalo, Jefferson, Jenkins, Mike Johnson, McCormick, Muscarello, Nelson, and Seabaugh voted yea. Representative Gregory Miller abstained.

#### House Bill No. 39 by Representative Charles Owen

Representative Charles Owen presented House Bill No. 39, which provides for ex officio notaries public with certain limited authority for the Beauregard Parish School Board.

Representative Frieman offered a motion to report House Bill No. 39 favorably. Without objection, House Bill No. 39 was reported favorably by a vote of 12 yeas, 0 nays, and 1 abstention. Representatives Amedee, Boyd, Brown, Echols, Frieman, Garofalo, Jefferson, Jenkins, Mike Johnson, McCormick, Muscarello, and Seabaugh voted yea. Representative Gregory Miller abstained.

#### House Bill No. 450 by Representative Charles Owen

Representative Charles Owen presented House Bill No. 450, which provides for access to an adopted person's original birth certificate. Representative Charles Owen provided a handout, Exhibit A, which is included in the committee records.
