III. DISCUSSION OF LEGISLATION

House Bill No. 960 by Representative Wilford Carter

Representative Wilford Carter presented House Bill No. 960, which creates the North Lake Charles Economic Development District.

Representative Newell offered amendments that:

- 1. Made changes to the district's boundaries and board appointments.
- 2. Authorized the district to levy a sales tax but removed the district's authority to levy a hotel occupancy tax or implement hotel tax increment financing.

Representative Newell offered a motion to adopt the proposed amendments, to which Representative Farnum objected. The administrative assistant called the roll, and the motion failed to pass by a vote of 4 yeas and 8 nays. Representatives Freiberg, Lyons, Newell, and Willard voted yea. Representatives Edmonds, DuBuisson, Farnum, Fontenot, Gadberry, Kerner, McKnight, and Schamerhorn voted nay.

Representative Edmonds offered a motion to voluntarily defer action on House Bill No. 960. Without objection, action on House Bill No. 960 was voluntarily deferred by a vote of 12 yeas and 0 nays. Representatives Edmonds, DuBuisson, Farnum, Fontenot, Freiberg, Gadberry, Kerner, Lyons, McKnight, Newell, Schamerhorn, and Willard voted yea.

Representative Lyons offered a motion to report Senate Bill No. 475 favorably. Without objection, Senate Bill No. 475 was reported favorably by a vote of 11 yeas and 0 nays. Representatives Edmonds, DuBuisson, Farnum, Fontenot, Freiberg, Gadberry, Kerner, Lyons, McKnight, Newell, and Schamerhorn voted yea.
