III. DISCUSSION OF LEGISLATION

Senate Bill No. 237 by Senator Pressly

Senator Pressly presented Senate Bill No. 237, which provides relative to industrial and consumable hemp.

Representative Cox offered an amendment to remove proposed law prohibiting any person from the process, sale, or offer for sale of any alcoholic beverage containing any THC. Representative Cox offered a motion to adopt the proposed amendment, to which Representative Villio objected. The administrative assistant called the roll, and the motion failed to pass by a vote of 5 years and 6 nays.

Representatives Boyer, Cox, Knox, LaFleur, and Walters voted yea. Representatives Villio, Adams, Bacala, Fontenot, Horton, and Wiley voted nay.

Representative Horton offered a motion to report Senate Bill No. 237 favorably, to which Representative Walters objected. The administrative assistant called the roll, and Senate Bill No. 237 was reported favorably by a vote of 7 yeas and 5 nays. Representatives Villio, Bacala, Cox, Fontenot, Horton, Ventrella, and Wiley voted yea. Representatives Adams, Boyer, Knox, LaFleur, and Walters voted nay.

House Bill No. 453 by Representative Kerner

Representative Kerner presented House Bill No. 453, which eliminates the statute of limitations to prosecute the crime of molestation of a juvenile.

Representative LaFleur offered a motion to report House Bill No. 453 favorably. Without objection, House Bill No. 453 was reported favorably by a vote of 7 yeas and 0 nays. Representatives Villio, Bacala, Boyer, Horton, Knox, LaFleur, and Wiley voted yea.

Senate Bill No. 339 by Senator Harris

On behalf of the author, Representative Villio offered a motion to voluntarily defer action on Senate Bill No. 339, which provides relative to aggravated and simple obstruction of a highway of commerce. Without objection, action on Senate Bill No. 339 was voluntarily deferred by a vote of 7 yeas and 0 nays. Representatives Villio, Bacala, Boyer, Horton, Knox, LaFleur, and Wiley voted yea.

Senate Bill No. 429 by Senator Coussan

Senator Coussan presented Senate Bill No. 429, which provides relative to the Child Abuse Neglect Registry.

Zach Daniels, Louisiana District Attorneys Association, 2525 Quail Dr., Baton Rouge, LA 70808, spoke in support of Senate Bill No. 429.

Representative LaFleur offered a motion to report Senate Bill No. 429 favorably. Without objection, Senate Bill No. 429 was reported favorably by a vote of 7 yeas and 0 nays. Representatives Villio, Bacala, Boyer, Horton, Knox, LaFleur, and Wiley voted yea.

House Resolution No. 170 by Representative Mandie Landry

Representative Mandie Landry presented House Resolution No. 170, which requests the House Committee on Administration of Criminal Justice, or a subcommittee thereof, to study the current structure of the Board of Pardons. After discussion, Representative Mandie Landry withdrew House Resolution No. 170.

House Resolution No. 193 by Representative Mandie Landry

Representative Mandie Landry presented House Resolution No. 193, which establishes a subcommittee of the House Committee on Administration of Criminal Justice to examine matters relative to missing persons and unidentified and unclaimed remains.

Representative Walters offered a motion to report House Resolution No. 193 favorably. Without objection, House Resolution No. 193 was reported favorably by a vote of 9 yeas and 0 nays. Representatives Villio, Adams, Bacala, Boyer, Cox, Knox, LaFleur, Walters, and Wiley voted yea.

House Concurrent Resolution No. 85 by Representative Mandie Landry

Representative Mandie Landry presented House Concurrent Resolution No. 85, which directs the Louisiana State Law Institute to conduct a study of the criminal statutes relating to white-collar crimes, financial crimes, and crimes involving elected officials.

Representative Adams offered a motion to report House Concurrent Resolution No. 85 favorably. Without objection, House Concurrent Resolution No. 85 was reported favorably by a vote of 10 years and 0 nays. Representatives Villio, Adams, Bacala, Boyer, Cox, Fontenot, Knox, LaFleur, Walters, and Wiley voted yea.

Senate Bill No. 466 by Senator Edmonds

On behalf of Senator Edmonds, Representative Bacala presented Senate Bill No. 466, which provides relative to criminal trespass.

Representative Villio offered a motion to report Senate Bill No. 466 favorably. Without objection, Senate Bill No. 466 was reported favorably by a vote of 9 yeas and 0 nays. Representatives Villio, Adams, Bacala, Boyer, Cox, Fontenot, Knox, LaFleur, and Walters voted yea.

House Resolution No. 191 by Representative Bayham

Representative Bayham presented House Resolution No. 191, which requests the Louisiana State Law Institute to study the feasibility of statewide bail schedules.

Representative Bacala offered a motion to report House Resolution No. 191 favorably. Without objection, House Resolution No. 191 was reported favorably by a vote of 7 yeas and 0 nays. Representatives Villio, Bacala, Cox, Horton, Knox, Walters, and Wiley voted yea.

Senate Bill No. 107 by Senator Mizell

Senator Mizell presented Senate Bill No. 107, which creates the crime of possessing, trafficking, or importing a child sex doll.

Representative Villio offered an amendment to change the age of the doll's resemblance from twelve years to eighteen years within the definition of "child sex doll". Representative Villio offered a motion to adopt the proposed amendment. Without objection, the amendment was adopted by a vote of 8 yeas and 0 nays. Representatives Villio, Adams, Bacala, Cox, Horton, Knox, Walters, and Wiley voted yea.

Representative Horton offered a motion to report Senate Bill No. 107 with amendments. Without

objection, Senate Bill No. 107 was reported with amendments by a vote of 9 yeas and 0 nays. Representatives Villio, Adams, Bacala, Cox, Horton, Knox, LaFleur, Walters, and Wiley voted yea.

Jessica Zuppardo, Homeland Security Investigations, 1250 Poydras St., Ste. 2200, New Orleans, LA 70113, spoke in support of Senate Bill No. 107.
