III. DISCUSSION OF LEGISLATION

Representative Turner in the chair.

House Bill No. 55 by Representative Owen

Representative Owen presented House Bill No. 55, which designates Act No. 470 of the 2022 Regular Session as "The Jean and Elise Act".

Representative Wyble offered a motion to report House Bill No. 55 favorably. Without objection, House Bill No. 55 was reported favorably by a vote of 13 yeas and 0 nays. Representatives Brown, Carlson, Wilford Carter, Chenevert, Edmonston, Glorioso, Egan, Mike Johnson, Larvadain, Melerine, Taylor, Turner, and Wyble voted yea.

House Bill No. 161 by Representative Bayham

Representative Bayham presented House Bill No. 161, which provides relative to nondisclosure agreements.

Representative Glorioso offered amendments to add an exception that the provisions of proposed law shall not restrict the ability of an individual to enter into a confidential settlement agreement relating to cases involving sexual harrassment or a hostile work environment that arise during the employment period and to make technical changes. Representative Glorioso offered a motion to adopt the proposed amendments. Without objection, the amendments were adopted by a vote of 12 yeas and 0 nays. Representatives Brown, Carlson, Wilford Carter, Chenevert, Edmonston, Glorioso, Egan, Larvadain, Melerine, Taylor, Turner, and Wyble voted yea.

Morgan Lamandre, STAR, 5615 Corporate Blvd., Ste. 200, Baton Rouge, LA 70808, spoke in support of House Bill No. 161.

Representative Carlson offered a motion to report House Bill No. 161 with amendments. Without objection, House Bill No. 161 was reported with amendments by a vote of 13 yeas, 0 nays, and 1 abstention. Representatives Brown, Carlson, Wilford Carter, Chenevert, Edmonston, Glorioso, Egan, Larvadain, Melerine, Taylor, Turner, Wright, and Wyble voted yea. Representative Muscarello abstained.

House Bill No. 449 by Representative Melerine

Representative Melerine presented House Bill No. 449, which provides relative to delivery of judgment of interdiction.

Representative Melerine offered amendments to provide that the curator shall provide the date of birth and the last four digits of the social security number of the interdict to the registrar of voters and to make technical changes. Representative Melerine offered a motion to adopt the proposed amendments. Without objection, the amendments were adopted by a vote of 14 yeas, 0 nays, and 1 abstention. Representatives Brown, Carlson, Wilford Carter, Chenevert, Edmonston, Glorioso, Egan, Larvadain, Melerine, Taylor, Turner, Ventrella, Wright, and Wyble voted yea. Representative Muscarello abstained.

Representative Wyble offered a motion to report House Bill No. 449 with amendments. Without objection, House Bill No. 449 was reported with amendments by a vote of 12 yeas, 0 nays, and 1 abstention.
