III. DISCUSSION OF LEGISLATION

House Bill No. 14 by Representative Geymann

On behalf of Representative Geymann, Representative Melerine offered a motion to voluntarily defer action on House Bill No. 14, which limits the amount of money that may be appropriated in a fiscal year. Without objection, action on House Bill No. 14 was voluntarily deferred by a vote of 14 yeas and 0 nays. Representatives Muscarello, Brown, Carlson, Wilford Carter, Chenevert, Edmonston, Egan, Glorioso, Mike Johnson, Melerine, Taylor, Turner, Ventrella, and Wyble voted yea.

House Bill No. 7 by Representative Emerson

Representative Emerson presented House Bill No. 7, a constitutional amendment, which revises Article VII of the Constitution of Louisiana.

Richard Nelson, secretary, Louisiana Department of Revenue, 617 N. 3rd St., Baton Rouge, LA 70802, spoke for information only on House Bill No. 7.

Representative Melerine offered a motion to adopt the House Rule 6.8(A) Report to House Bill No. 7, which stated that the measure could not be accomplished statutorily and would, therefore, require a constitutional amendment, to which Representative Wilford Carter objected. The administrative assistant called the roll, and the House Rule 6.8(A) Report to House Bill No. 7 was adopted by a vote of 11 yeas and 3 nays. Representatives Muscarello, Carlson, Chenevert, Edmonston, Egan, Glorioso, Mike Johnson, Melerine, Turner, Ventrella, and Wyble voted yea. Representatives Brown, Wilford Carter, and Taylor voted nay.

Representative Melerine offered a motion to report House Bill No. 7 without amendments, to which Representative Wilford Carter objected. The administrative assistant called the roll, and House Bill No. 7 was reported without amendments by a vote of 11 yeas and 3 nays. Representatives Muscarello, Carlson, Chenevert, Edmonston, Egan, Glorioso, Mike Johnson, Melerine, Turner, Ventrella, and Wyble voted yea. Representatives Brown, Wilford Carter, and Taylor voted nay.
