III. BUSINESS

House Bill No. 5 by Representative Bacala

Representative Bacala presented House Bill No. 5, which requires school systems to provide a salary increase for teachers and other school employees using savings attributable to the state's payment of certain unfunded accrued liability of the Teachers' Retirement System of Louisiana.

Representative Schlegel offered amendments to House Bill No. 5 that specified with respect to positions to which the law applies. Representative Schlegel offered a motion to adopt the proposed amendments. Without objection, the amendments were adopted by a vote of 12 yeas and 0 nays. Representatives Schlegel, Amedée, Brass, Carlson, Edmonston, Freiberg, Melerine, Owen, St. Blanc, Tarver, Taylor, and Young voted yea.

Representative Brass offered amendments to House Bill No. 5 to provide, relative to school systems not realizing sufficient savings to fully fund salary increases and benefits, that remaining funding shall be provided for in the MFP formula. Representative Brass offered a motion to adopt the proposed amendments. Without objection, the amendments were adopted by a vote of 13 yeas and 0 nays. Representatives Schlegel, Amedée, Brass, Carlson, Carver, Edmonston, Freiberg, Melerine, Owen, St. Blanc, Tarver, Taylor, and Young voted yea.

Senator Rick Edmonds, District 6, no witness card provided, spoke in support of House Bill No. 5.

Dr. Keith Courville, Associated Professional Educators of Louisiana, 7907 Wrenwood Boulevard, Suite B, no city or state provided, spoke in support of House Bill No. 5.

Larry Carter, Louisiana Federation of Teachers, 9623 Brookline Avenue, Baton Rouge, LA 70809, spoke for information only on House Bill No. 5.

Representative Carlson offered a motion to report House Bill No. 5 with amendments. Without objection, House Bill No. 5 was reported with amendments by a vote of 12 yeas and 0 nays. Representatives Schlegel, Amedée, Brass, Carlson, Carver, Edmonston, Freiberg, Melerine, Owen, St. Blanc, Tarver, and Young voted yea.
