House Bill No. 5 by Representative Marcelle

Without objection, the amendments were adopted by a vote of 16 yeas and 0 nays. Representatives Beaullieu, Billings, Boyd, Carlson, Wilford Carter, Carver, Gadberry, Mike Johnson, Larvadain, Lyons, Marcelle, Newell, Schamerhorn, Thomas, Wright, and Wyble voted yea.

Representative Beaullieu offered a motion to voluntarily defer action on House Bill No. 7. Without objection, action on House Bill No. 7 was voluntarily deferred by a vote of 15 yeas and 0 nays. Representatives Beaullieu, Billings, Boyd, Carlson, Wilford Carter, Carver, Gadberry, Larvadain, Lyons, Marcelle, Newell, Schamerhorn, Thomas, Wright, and Wyble voted yea.

House Bill No. 13 by Representative Melerine

Representative Melerine presented House Bill No. 13, a constitutional amendment that increases the number of associate supreme court justices (Items #3 and #4).

Representative Beaullieu offered a motion to voluntarily defer action on House Bill No. 13. Without objection, action on House Bill No. 13 was voluntarily deferred by a vote of 14 yeas and 0 nays. Representatives Beaullieu, Billings, Boyd, Carlson, Wilford Carter, Carver, Mike Johnson, Larvadain, Lyons, Newell, Schamerhorn, Thomas, Wright, and Wyble voted yea.
