**III. DISCUSSION OF LEGISLATION****House Bill No. 4 by Representative Marcelle**

Representative Marcelle presented House Bill No. 4, which provides relative to the assessment of penalties for failure to timely file required reports (Item #8).

Representative Marcelle offered a motion to voluntarily defer action on House Bill No. 4. Without objection, action on House Bill No. 4 was voluntarily deferred by a vote of 16 yeas and 0 nays. Representatives Beaulieu, Billings, Boyd, Carlson, Wilford Carter, Carver, Farnum, Gadberry, Larvadain, Lyons, Marcelle, Newell, Schamerhorn, Thomas, Wright, and Wyble voted yea.

**House Bill No. 5 by Representative Marcelle**

Representative Marcelle presented House Bill No. 5, which provides relative to the election districts for members of congress (Item #1).

Representative Marcelle offered a motion to voluntarily defer action on House Bill No. 5. Without objection, action on House Bill No. 5 was voluntarily deferred by a vote of 17 yeas and 0 nays. Representatives Beaulieu, Billings, Boyd, Carlson, Wilford Carter, Carver, Farnum, Gadberry, Mike Johnson, Larvadain, Lyons, Marcelle, Newell, Schamerhorn, Thomas, Wright, and Wyble voted yea.

**House Bill No. 7 by Representative Melerine**

Representative Melerine presented House Bill No. 7, which provides relative to supreme court districts (Item #3).

Representative Beaulieu offered technical amendments to House Bill No. 7. Representative Beaulieu offered a motion to adopt the proposed amendments. Without objection, the amendments were adopted by a vote of 16 yeas and 0 nays. Representatives Beaulieu, Billings, Boyd, Carlson, Wilford Carter, Carver, Gadberry, Mike Johnson, Larvadain, Lyons, Marcelle, Newell, Schamerhorn, Thomas, Wright, and Wyble voted yea.

Representative Beaulieu offered a motion to voluntarily defer action on House Bill No. 7. Without objection, action on House Bill No. 7 was voluntarily deferred by a vote of 15 yeas and 0 nays. Representatives Beaulieu, Billings, Boyd, Carlson, Wilford Carter, Carver, Gadberry, Larvadain, Lyons, Marcelle, Newell, Schamerhorn, Thomas, Wright, and Wyble voted yea.

#### **House Bill No. 13 by Representative Melerine**

Representative Melerine presented House Bill No. 13, a constitutional amendment that increases the number of associate supreme court justices (Items #3 and #4).

Representative Beaulieu offered a motion to voluntarily defer action on House Bill No. 13. Without objection, action on House Bill No. 13 was voluntarily deferred by a vote of 14 yeas and 0 nays. Representatives Beaulieu, Billings, Boyd, Carlson, Wilford Carter, Carver, Mike Johnson, Larvadain, Lyons, Newell, Schamerhorn, Thomas, Wright, and Wyble voted yea.

#### **House Bill No. 14 by Representative Echols**
