III. DISCUSSION OF LEGISLATION

House Bill No. 22 by Representative Mike Johnson

Representative Mike Johnson presented House Bill No. 22, which provides relative to the districts of the supreme court (Item #14).

Attorney General Liz Murrill, Louisiana Department of Justice, 1885 North Third Street, Baton Rouge, LA 70804, spoke in favor of House Bill No. 22.

Judge Don Johnson, 19th Judicial Court, no address provided, Baton Rouge, LA, spoke in favor of House Bill No. 22.

Representative Marcelle offered a motion to report House Bill No. 22 favorably. Without objection, House Bill No. 22 was reported favorably by a vote of 16 yeas and 0 nays. Representatives Beaulieu, Billings, Boyd, Carlson, Wilford Carter, Carver, Domangue, Farnum, Gadberry, Larvadain, Lyons, Marcelle, Newell, Schamerhorn, Thomas, and Wyble voted yea.

House Bill No. 6 by Representative Muscarello

Representative Muscarello presented House Bill No. 6, which provides relative to the methods of execution and for confidentiality of records or information relating to the execution of a death sentence (Item #15).

Representatives Beaulieu, Billings, Carlson, Carver, Domangue, Farnum, Gadberry, Newell, Schamerhorn, Thomas, Wright, and Wyble voted yea. Representatives Boyd, Wilford Carter, Larvadain, Lyons, and Marcelle voted nay.


There were no announcements.
