Minutes of Meeting 2024 Regular Session April 10, 2024

I. CALL TO ORDER

Representative Gerald "Beau" Beaullieu, IV, chair of the House Committee on House and Governmental Affairs, called the meeting to order at 12:12 p.m. in Room 2, in the state capitol in Baton Rouge, Louisiana.

III. DISCUSSION OF LEGISLATION

House Bill No. 873 by Representative Emerson

Representative Emerson presented House Bill No. 873, which provides relative to elections.

Representative Beaullieu offered amendments to:

- 1. Remove the proposed change to the period for early voting.
- 2. Provide for a public drawing of lots procedure in the case of a tie in a second party primary election.
- 3. Provide for the opening of the qualifying period for spring elections in a nongubernatorial, odd-numbered election year.
- 4. Change the opening of the qualifying period for spring elections, except in a presidential election year, from the last Wednesday in January to the second Wednesday in January.
- 5. Direct the Louisiana State Law Institute to remove a citation reference if provision is enacted by House Bill No. 677.
- 6. Make technical changes.

Representative Beaullieu offered a motion to adopt the proposed amendments. Without objection, the amendments were adopted by a vote of 11 yeas and 0 nays. Representatives Beaullieu, Bayham, Billings, Domangue, Gadberry, Larvadain, Lyons, Marcelle, Schamerhorn, Thomas, and Wyble voted yea.

Lani Boyd, office of the secretary of state, P.O. Box 94125, Baton Rouge, LA 70804, spoke for information only on House Bill No. 873.

Representative Beaullieu offered a motion to report House Bill No. 873 with amendments. Without objection, House Bill No. 873 was reported with amendments by a vote of 12 yeas and 0 nays. Representatives Beaullieu, Bayham, Billings, Domangue, Farnum, Gadberry, Larvadain, Lyons, Marcelle, Schamerhorn, Thomas, and Wyble voted yea.

House Bill No. 767 by Representative Emerson

Representative Emerson presented House Bill No. 767, which provides a limited exception for the schedule of a statewide elected official.

Representative Marcelle offered a motion to report House Bill No. 767 favorably. Without objection, House Bill No. 767 was reported favorably by a vote of 13 yeas and 0 nays. Representatives Beaullieu, Bayham, Billings, Domangue, Farnum, Gadberry, Larvadain, Lyons, Marcelle, Schamerhorn, Thomas, Wright, and Wyble voted yea.

House Bill No. 906 by Representative Wright

Representatives Beaullieu, Bayham, Billings, Wilford Carter, Domangue, Farnum, Gadberry, Larvadain, Marcelle, Schamerhorn, Thomas, Wright, and Wyble voted yea. Representatives Lyons and Newell voted nay.
