III. DISCUSSION OF LEGISLATION

Senate Bill No. 187 by Senator Boudreaux

Senator Boudreaux presented Senate Bill No. 187, which creates a pilot program for Medicaid recipients to utilize portable oxygen concentrators.

Representative Stagni offered a motion to report Senate Bill No. 187 favorably. Without objection, Senate Bill No. 187 was reported favorably by a vote of 10 yeas and 0 nays. Representatives Miller, Berault, Chenevert, Dickerson, Echols, Egan, Fisher, McMahen, Selders, and Stagni voted yea.

House Bill No. 867 by Representative Henry

Representative Henry presented House Bill No. 867, which provides for the practice of audiology and speech-language pathology.

Representative Stagni offered a motion to voluntarily defer action on House Bill No. 867. Without objection, action on House Bill No. 867 was voluntarily deferred by a vote of 10 yeas and 0 nays. Representatives Miller, Berault, Chenevert, Dickerson, Echols, Egan, Fisher, McMahen, Selders, and Stagni voted yea.

Senate Bill No. 40 by Senator Allain

Senator Allain presented Senate Bill No. 40, which provides relative to seafood safety.

Representative Miller offered amendments to:

- (1) Place the Seafood Safety Task Force under the Department of Culture, Recreation, and Tourism.
- (2) Add that the Seafood Safety Task Force may make recommendations on the use of money in the imported seafood safety fund.

(3) Clarify that the task force shall recommend methods for protecting Louisiana from foreign shrimp.

- (4) Allow the lieutenant governor to assign matters to the task force.
- (5) Remove three proposed members from the task force.
- (6) Require the Department of Culture, Recreation, and Tourism to promulgate any rules necessary to implement proposed law.
- (7) Make technical changes.

Representative Miller offered a motion to adopt the proposed amendments. Without objection, the amendments were adopted by a vote of 10 yeas and 0 nays. Representatives Miller, Berault, Chenevert, Dickerson, Echols, Egan, Fisher, McMahen, Selders, and Stagni voted yea.

Representative Echols offered a motion to report Senate Bill No. 40 with amendments. Without objection, Senate Bill No. 40 was reported with amendments by a vote of 11 yeas and 0 nays. Representatives Miller, Berault, Chenevert, Dickerson, Echols, Egan, Fisher, McMahen, Selders, Stagni, and Turner voted yea.

Senate Bill No. 11 by Senator Foil

On behalf of Senator Foil, Melinda Richard, Louisiana Department of Health, 628 North Fourth Street, Baton Rouge, LA 70802, presented Senate Bill No. 11, which provides relative to the Louisiana Traumatic Head and Spinal Cord Injury Trust Fund.

Representative Miller offered a motion to report Senate Bill No. 11 favorably. Without objection, Senate Bill No. 11 was reported favorably by a vote of 10 yeas and 0 nays. Representatives Miller, Berault, Chenevert, Dickerson, Echols, Egan, McMahen, Selders, Stagni, and Turner voted yea.
