#### III. DISCUSSION OF LEGISLATION

## Senate Concurrent Resolution No. 57 by Senator Fesi

Senator Fesi presented Senate Concurrent Resolution No. 57, which memorializes Congress to help all residents of Louisiana who are displaced by hurricanes.

Representative Edmonston offered a motion to report Senate Concurrent Resolution No. 57 favorably. Without objection, Senate Concurrent Resolution No. 57 was reported favorably by a vote of 9 yeas, 0 nays, and 1 abstention. Representatives Braud, Brown, Chenevert, Dickerson, Edmonston, Galle, Hebert, Orgeron, and Wiley voted yea. Representative Robby Carter abstained.

# Senate Bill No. 131 by Senator Miller

Senator Miller presented Senate Bill No. 131, which provides for privileges on immovables.

On behalf of Senator Miller, Representative Robby Carter offered amendments to:

- (1) Remove proposed law requiring that payment provisions of all bonds furnished for public work contracts be construed as statutory bond provisions.
- (2) Remove proposed law relative to bonds failing to contain certain requirements being deemed to incorporate all requirements.

Representative Robby Carter offered a motion to adopt the proposed amendments. Without objection, the amendments were adopted by a vote of 12 yeas and 0 nays. Representatives Robby Carter, Braud, Brown, Chenevert, Dickerson, Edmonston, Galle, Hebert, LaCombe, Mandie Landry, Orgeron, and Wiley voted yea.

Representative Edmonston offered a motion to report Senate Bill No. 131 with amendments. Without objection, Senate Bill No. 131 was reported with amendments by a vote of 11 yeas and 0 nays. Representatives Robby Carter, Braud, Brown, Chenevert, Dickerson, Edmonston, Galle, Hebert, LaCombe, Orgeron, and Wiley voted yea.

# Senate Bill No. 186 by Senator Seabaugh

Senator Seabaugh presented Senate Bill No. 186, which provides relative to continuous service for the purpose of determination of chief judge.

Representative LaCombe offered a motion to report Senate Bill No. 186 favorably. Without objection, Senate Bill No. 186 was reported favorably by a vote of 11 yeas and 0 nays. Representatives Robby Carter, Braud, Brown, Chenevert, Dickerson, Edmonston, Galle, Hebert, LaCombe, Orgeron, and Wiley voted yea.
