III. DISCUSSION OF LEGISLATION

Senate Bill No. 1 by Senator Morris

Senator Morris and Representative McMakin presented Senate Bill No. 1, a constitutional amendment to provide for jurisdiction of courts.

Mr. Bruce Reilly, VOTE, 4930 Washington Ave., New Orleans, LA, spoke in opposition to Senate Bill No. 1.

Representative Mack offered a motion to report Senate Bill No. 1 favorably, to which Representative Hughes objected. The administrative assistant called the roll, and the motion failed to pass by a vote of 5 yeas, 7 nays, and 1 abstention. Representatives Chenevert, Dickerson, Hebert, Mack, and Zeringue voted yea. Representatives Brown, Green, Hughes, Jordan, LaCombe, LaFleur, and Orgeron voted nay. Representative Edmonston abstained.

Witness cards submitted by individuals who did not speak are as follows: 3 in opposition. Witness cards are included in the committee records.

Senate Bill No. 5 by Senator Morris

Senator Morris and Representative McMakin presented Senate Bill No. 5, a constitutional amendment to provide for elections to fill newly-created judgeships and judicial vacancies and for exceptions as to courts of limited or specialized jurisdictions.

Catherine Newsome, office of secretary of state, P.O. Box 94125, Baton Rouge, LA 70804, spoke for information only on Senate Bill No. 5.

Representative Mack offered a motion to report Senate Bill No. 5 favorably, to which Representative Jordan objected. The administrative assistant called the roll, and Senate Bill No. 5 was reported favorably by a vote of 7 yeas and 6 nays. Representatives Chenevert, Dickerson, Edmonston, Hebert, Mack, Orgeron, and Zeringue voted yea. Representatives Brown, Green, Hughes, Jordan, LaCombe, and LaFleur voted nay.
