Amendments proposed by House Committee on Retirement to Original House Bill No. 123 by Representative Daniel

AMENDMENT NO. 1

On page 2, at the end of line 8, change the period "." to a comma "," and add:

"provided that the penalty for such felonious conduct is set in law, or is recommended in the sentencing guidelines, as a minimum of five years imprisonment."

AMENDMENT NO. 2

On page 2, line 9, after "(2)", delete the remainder of the line and delete lines 10 through 15 in their entirety, and add:

"The employee contributions that were made to fund the convicted employee's participation in the plan shall be refunded, without interest. However, the actuarial value of such contributions shall be retained by the plan to the extent necessary to fund the retirement benefits of the convicted employee's spouse in an amount proportionate to the spouse's community interest in the plan, if any. The spouse shall receive retirement benefits in an amount proportionate to the community interest that enured to the spouse, based on the service credited to the employee's account prior to conviction. No further employee or employer contributions shall be made on behalf of the convicted employee. Any further service by the convicted employee shall not be applied as credit to the retirement system."
