(5) A commissioner shall hold office until his successor has been appointed and may succeed himself when so appointed by the police jury parish governing authority subject to the limitation provided in Subparagraph (3)(b) of this Subsection.

(6) Each commissioner shall be a registered voter with a minimum of two years prior residency within the parish.

(7) Any board of commissioners in the parish of Terrebonne may contract with the Terrebonne Parish Police Jury governing authority under the provisions of the Local Services Law and other constitutional and statutory authority with respect to the planning, financing, construction, maintenance and operation of Terrebonne General Hospital, including but without limitation the issuance of bonds by the hospital district as authorized by law for financing any portion of project cost and the expenditure of hospital bond funds of the parish of Terrebonne, on such terms and conditions as the board of commissioners and the police jury governing authority shall determine to be in the public interest.

(8) The board of commissioners may appoint a hospital director and otherwise provide for the administration of any facilities under its control without the approval of the medical staff as elsewhere required in this Chapter but in so doing may consult with the medical staff or others as the commissioners deem appropriate.

(9) The terms and provisions of any agreement between the board of commissioners, as the governing authority of the hospital district, and the police jury, as the governing authority of the parish of Terrebonne, shall control over other provisions of this Chapter with respect to the planning, financing, construction, maintenance and operation of Terrebonne General Hospital unless prohibited by law.
