A JOINT RESOLUTION

Proposing to amend Article VIII, Section 5(D)(3) of the Constitution of Louisiana, relative to public colleges and universities; to provide relative to the closure of or conversion from four-year to two-year a public institution of higher education; to require a feasibility study by the Board of Regents; to require the Board of Regents to submit its written findings and recommendations to the legislature; to require a two-thirds vote of the members of each house of the legislature to take affirmative action on any proposal to close or convert from four-year to two-year any public institution of higher education; and to specify an election for submission of the proposition to electors and provide a ballot proposition.

A. The Joint Administration Committee on Prescriptive Authority for Advanced Practice Registered Nurses is hereby created under the joint jurisdiction of the Louisiana State Board of Nursing and the Louisiana State Board of Medical Examiners.

B. The committee shall consist of ~~ten~~ eight members as follows:

(1) ~~Four~~ Two nonvoting members shall be appointed by the governor including in the following manner:

(a) ~~Two~~ One advanced practice registered nurses, one of whom shall be practicing in a rural area, appointed from a list of four names submitted nurse appointed by the Louisiana State Nurses Association.

(b) ~~Two~~ physicians, one of whom shall be practicing in a rural area, appointed from a list of four names submitted One physician appointed by the Louisiana State Medical Society.

(2) ~~One~~ registered nurse who serves ~~Three~~ registered nurses who serve on the Louisiana State Board of Nursing, appointed by the board.

(3) ~~One~~ member who serves ~~Three~~ members who serve on the Louisiana State Board of Medical Examiners, appointed by the board.

(4) ~~One~~ member who serves on the Louisiana State Board of Pharmacy, appointed by the board.

(5) ~~The~~ secretary of the Department of Health and Hospitals, or his designee.

(6) ~~One~~ member of the Senate Committee on Health and Welfare, appointed by the president of the Senate.

(7) ~~One~~ member of the House Committee on Health and Welfare, appointed by the speaker of the House of Representatives.

C. ~~Each~~ member appointed by the governor and each member appointed by their respective board shall be subject to Senate confirmation.

~~D.C.~~ The initial members of the committee shall be appointed no later than ~~October 1, 1995~~ August 30, 1997. If any of the designated boards or associations fail to submit a list of nominees make their respective appointments by September 1, ~~1995~~ 1997, the governor secretary of the Department of Health and Hospitals shall appoint the respective member of the committee. ~~without the nomination list established by this Section.~~

E. ~~The~~ term of the committee members shall expire on July 1, 1997. ~~However, each~~ D. Each member shall serve until his successor has been appointed: at the pleasure of the appointing authority. Any vacancy occurring in the membership of the committee shall be filled for the unexpired term within sixty days in the same manner as the original appointment.

E. The committee shall hold its initial meeting no later than ~~December 1, 1995~~ September 15, 1997 and shall meet at least quarterly thereafter, on a date and at a time and place as it may designate. The committee may meet at such other times as considered necessary by the chairman or by the majority of its members. Notice of all meetings shall be given in the manner prescribed by law. All meetings of the committee shall be subject to R.S. 42:4.1, et seq. In addition, the committee shall be subject to the Administrative Procedure Act.

~~G-F.~~ The governor shall initially appoint the chairperson and the committee may elect such other officers as it considers necessary to carry out their duties and functions.

~~H.~~ All legislative members of the committee shall receive the same per diem and travel allowance for attending meetings of the committee as is normally provided for members of the legislature.

~~I.~~ Nonlegislative members ~~G.~~ Members of the committee shall be reimbursed for actual expenses for necessary travel and mileage to the extent that funds are made available for such purpose.

~~J.~~ ~~H.~~ Staff employed by the Louisiana State Board of Nursing and the Louisiana State Board of Medical Examiners shall be made available to the committee as necessary to effectuate implement the provisions of this Part.

§1032. Powers and duties of the committee

A. The committee shall:

(1) ~~Not later than January 1, 1996, February 15, 1998, recommend develop and approve rules and regulations for limited prescriptive authority for advanced practice registered nurses for submission to the Louisiana State Board of Nursing and the Louisiana State Board of Medical Examiners for the adoption of rules and regulations governing the formulation of demonstration projects using advanced practice registered nurses to provide specified prescriptive services under physician direction in certain underserved health care areas and certain areas of demonstrated health care needs in the state as determined by appropriate and scientific criteria, including but not limited to physician to general population ratios; joint promulgation.~~ The boards shall act upon the committee's ~~recommended~~ rules and regulations within forty-five days from the date of receipt by the chairmen of the ~~board~~ boards. In the event the boards do not act upon such ~~recommended~~ the committee's rules and regulations within sixty days, such inaction shall constitute approval by the boards of the ~~recommended~~ committee's rules and regulations, and the boards shall promulgate such rules and regulations in accordance with the Administrative Procedure Act.

(2) ~~Recommend the location and scope of prescriptive authority under physician direction in the designated areas of need in accordance with rules and regulations recommended by the committee and approved by the Louisiana Board of Nursing and the Louisiana State Board of Medical Examiners. Review and approve applications for collaborative agreements for limited prescriptive authority.~~

B. The committee may recommend ~~limited prescriptive authority under physician direction. Such authority may also include the ability authority~~ to receive and distribute a therapeutic regimen of prepackaged drugs prepared and labeled by a licensed pharmacist and free samples supplied by a drug manufacturer.

§1033. Report

The committee shall make a written report of its activities to the Joint Committee on Health and Welfare prior to the 1996 Regular Session and a written report of its findings, recommendations, and proposed legislation regarding prescriptive authority for advanced practice registered nurses sixty days prior to the 1997 Regular Session. The Joint Committee on Health and Welfare shall hold nine regional public meetings throughout the state prior to the 1997 Regular Session to obtain public response to the written report on the activities of advanced practice registered nurses as authorized in this Part and any proposed legislation related to the practice of advanced practice registered nurses.

§1034. Administration of Part

A. The provisions of this Part shall be ~~jointly~~ administered by the Louisiana State Board of Nursing ~~and the Louisiana State Board of Medical Examiners~~. The rules and regulations ~~recommended developed and approved~~ by the committee and approved by the boards shall be jointly promulgated by the Louisiana State Board of Nursing and the Louisiana State Board of Medical Examiners. However, the Louisiana State Board of Nursing shall have exclusive enforcement authority over the advanced practice registered nurses.

B. Notwithstanding any laws to the contrary, a certified registered nurse anesthetist shall not be required to have prescriptive authority to provide anesthesia care, including the administration of medications, anesthetics, and ancillary services necessary for the delivery of care within his scope of practice under the direction and supervision of a physician or dentist who is licensed to practice under the laws of the state of Louisiana, in accordance with R.S. 37:930.

~~C.~~ Notwithstanding any laws to the contrary, a licensed pharmacist shall accept the prescription of an advanced practice registered nurse who has been granted prescriptive authority according to the provisions set forth in this Part.

§1034. Continued practice of previously authorized advanced practice registered nurses

Notwithstanding any laws to the contrary, nothing herein shall prohibit an advanced practice registered nurse qualified or who may qualify under Act 629 of the 1995 Regular Session and rules and regulations jointly promulgated by the Louisiana State Board of Nursing and the Louisiana State Board of Medical Examiners on October 20, 1996, from continuing to practice with limited prescriptive authority until new rules and regulations are developed and approved by the Joint Administration Committee on Prescriptive Authority for Advanced Practice Registered Nurses and jointly promulgated by said boards.

§1035. Termination

The computation of average compensation shall be as follows:

(i) The amount for the first through the twelfth month shall not exceed the actual compensation for the immediately preceding twelve months by more than fifteen percent.

(ii) The amount for the thirteenth through the twenty-fourth month shall not exceed the actual compensation amount for the first through twelfth month by more than fifteen percent.

(iii) The amount for the twenty-fifth through the thirty-sixth month shall not exceed the actual compensation amount for the thirteenth through the twenty-fourth month by more than fifteen percent.

(b) The thirty-six months used for computing average compensation shall not cover a period which would result in the member receiving more than three years of service credit.

(c) The limitations regarding the computation of average compensation in this Subsection shall not apply to any of the twelve-month periods where compensation increased by more than fifteen percent over the previous twelve-month period solely because of an increase in compensation by a system-wide increase enacted by the Department of Civil Service and approved by the governor, or a pay adjustment enacted by the legislature.

(2)(a) The exemption shall be for an initial term of no more than five calendar years, and may be renewed for an additional five years. All property exempted shall be listed on the assessment rolls and submitted to the Louisiana Tax Commission or its successor, but no taxes shall be collected thereon during the period of exemption.

(b) Beginning January 1, 2000 any contract for an initial term or for a renewal of a contract shall provide for an exemption from ad valorem taxes as follows:

(i) For the taxable year beginning January 1, 2000, eighty percent.

(ii) For the taxable year beginning January 1, 2001, sixty percent.

(iii) For the taxable year beginning January 1, 2002, forty percent.

(iv) For the taxable year beginning January 1, 2003, twenty percent.

(v) For taxable years beginning January 1, 2004 and thereafter, no exemption shall be granted or shall be in effect."
