All unexpended and unencumbered monies in this fund at the end of the fiscal year shall remain in the fund. The monies in the fund shall be invested by the state treasurer in the same manner as monies in the state general fund. Interest earned by the investment of monies in the fund shall be credited to the fund.
- Subject to an annual appropriation by the legislature, the monies in the Wildlife Enforcement Enhancement Fund shall be used solely to enhance enforcement programs which generate compliance with laws, rules, and regulations designed to conserve and protect the natural resources of the state and to ensure public safety.

D. The state treasurer shall prepare a quarterly report indicating the income to the fund from all sources and the fund balances. Such report shall be submitted each quarter to the department.

E. It is the purpose of this Section to provide for supplemental appropriations to the enforcement division of the Department of Wildlife and Fisheries. Appropriations from the Wildlife Enforcement Enhancement Fund shall be used to supplement appropriations made from the Conservation Fund for the enforcement division of the Department of Wildlife and Fisheries and shall not be used to supplant such appropriations from the Conservation Fund.
