A. Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, a license issued by the board to conduct slot machine gaming at an eligible facility in Orleans Parish shall be subject to the following limitations regarding the number of slot machines which may be operated at the eligible facility:

(1) On or after July 1, 2003, the eligible facility shall be authorized to have a maximum of three hundred slot machines at the eligible facility.

(2) On or after July 1, 2004, the eligible facility shall be authorized to have a maximum of four hundred slot machines at the eligible facility.

(3) On or after July 1, 2005, the eligible facility shall be authorized to have a maximum of five hundred slot machines at the eligible facility.

(4) At any time after July 1, 2005, in the event the gross gaming revenues of the casino gaming operator as defined in R.S. 27:205(5) exceed three hundred fifty million dollars for any proceeding twelve-month period, the eligible facility shall be authorized to have a maximum of seven hundred slot machines.

B. Notwithstanding the provisions of Subsection A of this Section if the Amended and Renegotiated Casino Operating Contract entered into on October 30, 1998, as previously amended effective October 19, 1999, March 8, 2001, and March 29, 2001, is terminated the eligible facility located in Orleans Parish shall not be limited to a fixed number of slot machines which may be placed in the designated gaming area set forth in R.S. 27:372.

C. An eligible facility located in Orleans Parish shall be subject to all licensing requirements and limitations provided by this Chapter in addition to the provisions of this Section.
