"(ii) The judge shall receive as a base annual benefit that proportion of his annual judicial pay, as it exists on the date of his retirement, which his number of years served on a court of record bears to twenty-five. As a supplemental benefit, a judge covered by R.S. 11:1351 through 1358 shall receive a sum equal to three and one-half percent of his annual judicial pay, as it exists on the date of his retirement, for each year, not to exceed four years, that he served in the armed forces of the United States, a sum equal to three and one-half percent of such pay for each year that he served as a member of the legislature of this state, and a sum equal to two and one-half percent of such pay for each year that he served in a prosecutorial capacity with an office of district attorney or any other political subdivision or agency of this state. As a supplemental benefit, a judge covered by the provisions of this Subpart shall receive a sum equal to what would otherwise be payable to him, as a retirement benefit by the Louisiana State Employees' Retirement System, assuming he was otherwise eligible for retirement thereunder, disregarding any age and years of service requirements, on account of his service in the armed forces of the United States, his service as a member of the legislature of this state, and his service rendered in a prosecutorial capacity with an office of district attorney or any other political subdivision or agency of this state, provided credit and benefits relative thereto are established in accordance with the otherwise applicable laws concerning same governing the Louisiana State Employees' Retirement System. However, in no case shall the total of benefits paid to any judge exceed one hundred percent of his judicial pay, as it exists on the date of his retirement.

(b) Any judge seeking to avail himself of the provisions of this Paragraph shall make application for such retirement before November 21, 1993, and such application shall be irrevocable.

(c) The Supreme Court for the state of Louisiana has the authority to continue the pay and benefits for those judges whose seats were not precleared by the United States Department of Justice until the effective retirement date for such judges; or until the lawsuits challenging those judgeships are finally resolved, including all appeals."

~~Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, the governing authority of an economic development district with boundaries coterminous with a parish having a population between thirteen thousand and thirteen thousand eight hundred persons, as established by the most recent federal decennial census, shall not levy or collect, or cause to be levied or collected, any ad valorem tax:~~

A. Subject to the provisions of R.S. 33:130.205, the district may levy and cause to be collected an ad valorem tax within the boundaries of the district for such purposes and at such rate as provided by the proposition authorizing its levy, provided the proposition is approved by a majority of the qualified electors of the district voting at an election held for that purpose.

B. Such an election shall be conducted in accordance with the provisions of the Louisiana Election Code and at the time another election is being conducted throughout the state.

C. The election on the proposition to levy the tax shall be held prior to July 1, 2004; if not approved by such date, the tax shall not be levied. The duration of the tax set forth in the proposition shall not exceed five years; however, such tax may be renewed for an additional period not to exceed five years."

A. The legislature hereby finds that in order to improve our juvenile justice system it is necessary that every juvenile in the custody of the Department of Public Safety and Corrections be reviewed periodically in order to determine whether the juvenile is placed in the least restrictive placement most appropriate to their needs and consistent with the circumstances of the case and the protection of the best interests of society and the safety of the public within the state. In order to facilitate the transition of the Swanson Correctional Center for Youth-Madison Parish Unit to alternate adult offender utilization as provided in R.S. 15:902.2, the provisions of this Section shall be applicable.

B. The placement review shall be conducted by the department through such multi-disciplinary review panel as the secretary of the department shall designate. This placement review shall include an assessment of the needs and progress of the individual juvenile, the risk of danger to society, and the community resources needed to serve the best interest of the child and society and a recommendation for placement and services.

C. The secretary of the department shall establish and promulgate rules, regulations, and procedures to govern the placement review process. Such rules shall include provisions for the department to notify appropriate law enforcement communities and any registered crime victim of the placement review recommendation at the time the recommendation is provided to the judge.

D. When the assessment results in a determination that the juvenile be transferred to a less restrictive setting, including but not limited to release pursuant to R. S. 15:906 or transfer pursuant to R. S. 15:907, the department shall develop recommendations for placement, care and treatment in accordance with the assessment.

E. If the recommendation includes placement in a less restrictive setting, the department shall file a motion with the court and serve a copy of the motion on the district attorney in accordance

with Children's Code Article 911. The motion shall include all of the following:

(1) The recommendation of the department.

(2) All relevant documentation supporting the recommendation including but not limited to the needs and risk assessments.

(3) An aftercare plan developed by the department when the recommendation is for release pursuant to R.S. 15:906.

F. The recommendations shall be implemented by the department unless the court, within fourteen legal days of receipt of the motion and accompanying documentation does any one of the following:

(1) Rejects the recommendations and denies the motion.

(2) Notifies the department in writing that there is no objection and the recommendations have been accepted as orders of the court.

(3) Schedules a hearing and issues an order rejecting or modifying the recommendations of the department.

G. Juveniles adjudicated delinquent and given a disposition under the provisions of Children's Code Article 897.1 shall not be eligible for consideration under the provisions of this Section."

The secretary of the Department of Public Safety and Corrections shall establish a special prestige license plate, to be known as the Sigma Gamma Rho Sorority, Incorporated plate, subject to the provisions of this Section. The license plate shall be restricted to passenger cars, pickup trucks, vans, and recreational vehicles. The color and design of the license plate shall be selected by the executive committee of the Sigma Gamma Rho Sorority, provided it is in compliance with the provisions of R.S. 47:463(A)(3), and shall include the sorority's logo.

B. The license plate shall be issued, upon application, to any member of the Sigma Gamma Rho Sorority, Incorporated. Each person who applies for the prestige license plate shall present to the office of motor vehicles a membership identification card indicating such membership.

C. An annual royalty fee of twenty-five dollars for the use of the sorority's logo shall be collected from the applicant and forwarded to the National Educational Fund of Sigma Gamma Rho Sorority, Incorporated for each license plate issued as provided in this Section.

The department shall also collect the standard registration license fee provided for in R.S. 47:463 and a handling fee of three dollars and fifty cents. The handling fee shall be retained by the department to offset a portion of administrative costs.

D. The monies received from the royalty fees for issuance and renewal of the license plate by the National Educational Fund of Sigma Gamma Rho Sorority, Incorporated shall be retained in the fund and used to support the national organization's scholarship and commitment to education program.

E. The secretary shall establish a prestige license plate in accordance with the provisions of this Section when all of the following conditions are met:

(1) All necessary contracts regarding use of the Sigma Gamma Rho Sorority's logo have been executed.

(2) The secretary has received a minimum of one thousand applications for the license plate.

F. The secretary shall establish rules and regulations as are necessary to implement the provisions of this Section, including but not limited to rules and regulations governing the collection and disbursement of royalty fees, verification that an applicant is a member of the Sigma Gamma Rho Sorority, the transfer and disposition of such license plates, the colors available, and the design criteria.

§463.114. Special prestige license plates; Zeta Phi Beta Sorority

A. The secretary of the Department of Public Safety and Corrections shall establish a special prestige license plate, to be known as the Zeta Phi Beta Sorority plate, subject to the provisions of this Section. The license plate shall be restricted to passenger cars, pickup trucks, vans, and recreational vehicles. The color and design of the license plate shall be selected by the executive committee of the Zeta Phi Beta Sorority, Inc., provided it is in compliance with R.S. 47:463(A)(3), and shall include the logo of the sorority.

B. The license plate shall be issued, upon application, to any member of the Zeta Phi Beta Sorority.

C. An annual royalty fee of twenty-five dollars for use of the sorority's logo shall be collected from the applicant and forwarded to the National Educational Foundation of Zeta Phi Beta Sorority, Inc. for each license plate issued as provided in this Section. The department shall also collect the standard registration license fee provided for in R.S. 47:463 and a handling fee of three dollars and fifty cents. The handling fee shall be retained by the department to offset a portion of administrative costs.

D. The monies received from the royalty fees for each initial issuance of a license plate and for each license plate renewal by the National Educational Foundation of Zeta Phi Beta Sorority, Inc. shall be retained by the foundation. The monies shall be used to support the national foundation's scholarship program.

E. The secretary shall establish a prestige license plate in accordance with the provisions of this Section when all of the following conditions are met:

(1) All necessary contracts regarding use of the Zeta Phi Beta Sorority's logo have been executed.

(2) The secretary has received a minimum of one thousand applications for the license plate.

E. The secretary shall establish rules and regulations as are necessary to implement the provisions of this Section, including but not limited to rules and regulations governing the collection and disbursement of royalty fees, verification that an applicant is a member of the Zeta Phi Beta Sorority, the transfer and disposition of such license plates, the colors available, and the design criteria."

SB 197 BOISSIERE (TBA) – CLERKS OF COURT RET: Deletes reference to the chairman of the Senate Finance Committee from provisions of law relating to per diem. (gov sig) **(Subject to Rule Suspension)**

SB 199 BOISSIERE (TBA) – CLERKS OF COURT RET: Provides that the chairman of the Senate Retirement Committee serve as an ex-officio member of the board. (gov sig) **(Subject to Rule Suspension)**

SB 203 BOISSIERE (TBA) – PAROCHIAL EMPLOYEES RET : Provides that limitations on benefits payable to highly compensated employees shall comply with Internal Revenue Code provisions. (gov sig) **(Subject to Rule Suspension)**

SB 1050 ADLEY (TBA) – RETIREMENT SYSTEMS: Provides that persons over the age of 65 shall not be required to participate in the Municipal Employees' Retirement System. (gov sig) **(Subject to Rule Suspension)**

SB 1097 DARDENNE (TBA) – TEACHERS RETIREMENT: Provides that the director and staff of the Louisiana Resource Center for Educators are teachers for the purposes of membership, relative to the Teachers Retirement System of Louisiana. (gov sig) **(Subject to Rule Suspension)**

SB 1109 BOISSIERE (TBA) – RETIREMENT BENEFITS: Repeals provision which excludes simultaneous membership in more than one public retirement system, relative to New Orleans Employees' Retirement System. (gov sig) **(Subject to Rule Suspension)**

HCR 176 DIEZ – MTR VEHICLE/TRUCKS: Creates the Motor Carrier Efficiency and Operations Task Force to study transportation coordination and efficiency within the Port of New Orleans

HB 108 HAMMETT – MTR VEHICLE/DRIVER LIC: Provides relative to third party testing

HB 1260 WADDELL – MTR VEHICLE/TRAILERS: Provides relative to the registration of certain trailers

HB 1880 G SMITH – AUCTIONS/SALES: Authorizes out-of-state salvage dealers to buy in this state

HB 2002 PITRE – MOTOR CARRIERS: Provides relative to goods, products, or commodities transported by common carrier

SB 42 MCPHERSON – PUBLIC CONTRACTS: Requires public entities issuing an addendum to a bid within a period of seven days prior to opening of the bids to notify the project's prime bidders by fax, e-mail, or/and delivery within 24 hours of the addendum issuance. (gov sig)

SB 70 GAUTREAUX – MOTOR VEHICLES: Prohibits driving a motor vehicle with a television capable of receiving any pre-recorded visual presentation unless the TV is behind the driver's seat or not visible to the driver while he is operating the vehicle and provides for certain exceptions.

SB 141 DUPRE – SCHOOL BUS DRIVERS: Provides for a restriction to commercial driver's licenses which would permit operation only of a school bus under certain circumstances.

SB 265 HOYT – TRAFFIC: Removes prohibitions of certain agencies contracting with collection agencies and credit information agencies for services relative to unpaid parking fines.

SB 366 SCHEDLER – ROADS/HIGHWAYS: Provides that retired or disabled firemen and policemen shall have free passage over the Lake Pontchartrain Causeway Bridge.

SB 470 HOYT – FEES/LICENSES/PERMITS: Authorizes special permit to move houses and provides for penalty for violation of such permit or for falsifying information on permit application. (2/3-CA7s2.1(A))

SB 583 MARIONNEAUX – AIRCRAFT/AVIATION: Adds a member from Iberville Parish and a member from West Baton Rouge Parish to the board of commissioners of the Louisiana Airport Authority. (gov sig)

SB 917 MALONE – MOTOR CARRIERS: Exempts motor carriers of salt water from proving public convenience and necessity.

SB 973 BOISSIERE – ROADS/HIGHWAYS: Provides for the procedure of certain appointments to the board of commissioners of the Regional Transit Authority.

SB 1095 JOHNSON – ROADS/HIGHWAYS: Provides for the Eastern New Orleans Interstate Oversight Commission and Traffic Control Officer program and relative to I-10 in eastern New Orleans if funding is made available. (gov sig)

SB 1103 SCHEDLER – ROADS/HIGHWAYS: Requires participation of local governing authority and legislators if a highway priority project in a locality is delayed and for substitution of another priority project in the same locality. (gov sig)

HB 210 ALARIO (TBA) – TAX/AD VALOREM TAX: (Constitutional Amendment) Increases the homestead exemption to \$15,000 of assessed valuation **(SUBJECT TO RULE SUSPENSION)**
