(b) For new direct jobs created which pay at least two and ~~one-fourth~~ one-half times the federal minimum hourly wage and which meet one of the following criteria, the benefit rate shall be six percent:

* * *

(4)(a) "New direct job" means employment in this state of an employee working at the average hours per week provided for in R.S. 51:2455(E)(2), who was not previously on an employer's payroll in Louisiana, nor previously on the payroll of such employer's parent entity, subsidiary, or affiliate in Louisiana, or previously on the payroll of any business whose physical plant and employees are substantially the same as those of the employer in Louisiana. Such job shall be with an employer that has qualified to receive a rebate pursuant to the provisions of this Chapter, which job did not exist in this state prior to the effective date the application was filed by the employer with the Department of Economic Development pursuant to the provisions of R.S. 51:2455 and which job is filled by an individual domiciled in the state of Louisiana.

(b) "New direct job" may also include employment with a company who has a facility management contract with the employer consistent with Subparagraph (a) of this Paragraph if all of the following criteria are satisfied:

(i) The facility management contract provides the company's employees with wage and basic health benefits consistent with Paragraphs (1) and (3) of this Section and is not an exempted profession or service industry in those Paragraphs.

(ii) The facility management contract provides the company's employees are working at the average hours per week provided for in R.S. 51:2455(E)(2).

(iii) The new direct jobs of the company are only counted as new direct jobs for the employer if the company's employees associated with the facility management contract are performing the substantial portion of their work for the employer's facility.

(iv) The new direct jobs of the company with the facility management contract did not exist prior to the effective date of the application filed with the Department of Economic Development by the employer. In addition, in determining the new direct jobs, the department shall certify that the employer and the facility management contractor have a combined net increase in employment and payroll at the facility for the new jobs.

(v) The employer is classified as a manufacturer as specified by R.S. 51:2453(1)(b)(ii).

(vi) The employer's contract with the company recognizes the Louisiana Quality Jobs Program, the term of the facility management contract is not less than the time remaining on the employer's contract with the Department of Economic Development, and the company agrees to provide to the employer and the Department of Economic Development the information necessary for participating in the rebate provided in this Chapter.

(vii) The employer's rebate for new direct jobs provided for through one or more facility management contracts shall be computed using eighty percent of the benefit rate as defined in R.S. 51:2453(3).

(viii) The provisions of R.S. 51:2453(4)(b) shall be effective until August 15, 2007. However, an employer which, prior to August 15, 2007, has been approved by the department to receive incentive tax rebates under the provisions of R.S. 51:2453(4)(b) shall continue to receive tax rebates pursuant to the terms of its agreement with the state of Louisiana as long as the employer retains its eligibility.

(c) "New direct job" shall not mean any job that is a result of job shifts due to the gain or loss of an in-state contract to supply goods and services.

(d) "New direct job" shall not mean any employees who were retained following the acquisition of all or part of an in-state business by an employer.

(6) "Facility management contract" shall mean a contract between an employer and another company whereby the company agrees to operate all or part of the employer's manufacturing facility.

§2454. Rebate approval

* * *

C.(1)(a) No contract shall be executed pursuant to under this Chapter with an employer who has defaulted on or otherwise not repaid any loan or other obligation involving public funds nor with any employer who has ever declared bankruptcy under which an obligation of the employer to pay or repay public funds or monies was discharged as part of such bankruptcy.

(b) No contract shall be executed under this Chapter with any employer who is in default on any filing or payment with or to the state or any of its agencies or political subdivisions and in which an assessment or judgment that is final and nonappealable has been rendered, and remains outstanding, in favor of the state, or any of its agencies, or political subdivisions.

(c) Violation of the provisions of this Subsection shall void the contract and any rebates paid to the employer prior to the date of discovery of such violation shall be added to the income tax liability of the employer for the taxable year in which the discovery occurred, with interest from the date of violation, and the employer shall receive no further rebates pursuant to this Chapter.

(4) In adopting a fee structure, the commission may consider the gross ton miles for railroad operations within the State of Louisiana for each railroad operating in the state to provide for the equitable allocation among railroads of the cost of administering the commission's rail safety program.

(5) The fees collected under this Section shall be collected for the Public Service Commission by the Department of Revenue in a manner similar to that performed by the department pursuant to R.S. 45:1177(B).

(6) These fees collected by the Department of Revenue shall be immediately deposited into the state treasury, and prior to these monies being placed into the state general fund, an amount equal to that deposited as required by this Section and the fees established by the Public Service Commission, shall be credited to a special fund hereby created in the state treasury to be known as the "Commission Rail Safety Program." The monies in this fund shall be used solely for the expenses of the operations of the commission in its administration of this program.

§562. Authority to inspect railroad facility

A. The Public Service Commission may enter private property on which a railroad facility that is connected to but not a part of a general railroad system of transportation is located at a reasonable time and in a reasonable manner to perform an inspection, investigation, or surveillance of facilities, equipment, records, and operations relating to general operations, rolling stock, and the packaging, loading, or transportation of hazardous materials to determine whether the railroad facility complies with the applicable safety requirements of this Section or orders adopted by the commission.

B. In performing an inspection under this Section, the commission shall not require a railroad facility owner or operator to alter or cease rail operations.

C. Any inspection, investigation, or surveillance performed on the site of a manufacturing facility shall be performed in compliance with the safety rules or regulations of the facility, including security clearance at the front gate if appropriate."
