AMENDMENT NO. 1

On page 1, line 14, after the comma "," and before "that" insert "based on the needs of that party and the ability of the other party to pay."

AMENDMENT NO. 2

On page 1, line 15, change "entitled to" to "awarded" and after "support" and before the period "." insert "in accordance with Paragraph B of this Article"

AMENDMENT NO. 3

On page 2, between lines 9 and 10, insert the following:

"Section 2. The provisions of this Act are intended to legislatively overrule the court's interpretation of Civil Code Articles 111 and 112 in *Hammack v. Hammack*, 1999-2809 (1st Cir. 12/22/00), 778 So. 2d 70 and in *Brett v. Brett*, 2000-0436 (1st Cir. 5/30/01), 794 So. 2d 912 wherein the need of the party was no longer a prerequisite, but merely a factor in the determination of spousal support.

Section 3. The provisions of this Act are interpretative and shall apply to pending claims for final periodic support in which trial has not yet commenced as of the effective date of this Act."
