The sheriff of the parish may enforce compliance with an ordinance adopted pursuant to this Paragraph.

The judges, en banc, may appoint such secretarial, clerical, research, administrative, or other personnel as they deem necessary to expedite the business and functions of the court and fix and pay all or any part of the salaries of such personnel out of the monies in the judicial expense fund.
