(2) The notice of the recognized political party's selection of a nominee as provided by Paragraph (1) of this Subsection shall be delivered to the secretary of state within ten days of the death or withdrawal or by 4:30 p.m. on the third calendar day after the second party primary election, whichever occurs first.

C. There shall be no third party primary. For any situation not specifically provided for herein, the state central committee of the recognized political party involved shall provide for the selection of a nominee from the candidates and shall provide notice of the selection of a nominee to the secretary of state no later than five business days after the second party primary election. In the case of a tie vote in the second party primary, the party's nominee for the general election shall be selected by a public drawing of lots conducted by the secretary of state."

Keep Louisiana Beautiful, Inc. is a recipient of grants from the Department of Environmental Quality under the Louisiana Litter Abatement Grant Program, a program funded by the one dollar driving license fee.

I find the connection between the possible enactment or adoption of this bill and the donation of office space to the corporation does not create a conflict of interest for me. Further, I fully understand that I hold my office as public trust. My role as an elected member of the Louisiana House of Representatives is to represent the interest of my constituents, and I will continue to do that to the best of my ability. A conflict of interest arises when the interests of my constituents and my interests diverge and conflict. Based on the foregoing, it is my opinion that there was no conflict of interest.
