* * *

B. (1)

* * *

(4) Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, the commissioner of administration shall enter into a boundary agreement with owners of land located east of the Mississippi River, and not an island, that has been lost through erosion, compaction, subsidence, or sea level rise occurring before October 1, 1976, and reclaimed prior to October 1, 1976, which land was commandeered by the state of Louisiana pursuant to Executive Order KBB 2006-6, provided the landowner furnishes reasonably satisfactory proof of each of the following items:

(a) Excluding any effect on ownership caused by erosion, compaction, subsidence or sea level rise occurring before October 1, 1976, the landowner is the owner of the reclaimed land.

(b)The land reclaimed was not inundated at the time of admission of Louisiana to statehood.

(c) The land reclaimed was lost to erosion, compaction, subsidence, or sea level rise.

(d) The reclamation occurred prior to October 1, 1976.

(e) The land was commandeered by the state of Louisiana pursuant to Executive Order KBB 2006-6.

(5) The boundary agreement entered into between the state and landowner pursuant to Paragraph (4), shall be to the full extent of the property to which the landowner demonstrated ownership pursuant to Subparagraph (4)(a). As a condition of the boundary agreement, the landowner shall waive any claim against the state for return of mineral revenues from the reclaimed land.

(6) For the purpose of Paragraph (4), without limiting the generality of the foregoing, lands reclaimed by a drainage district duly constituted under the laws of this state to drain and reclaim land shall be deemed to have been reclaimed for the benefit of the private landowner who owned the reclaimed property at the time of the reclamation, excluding any effect on ownership caused by the land being lost through erosion, compaction, subsidence, or sea level rise. Nothing in this Subsection shall affect the title of state water bottoms reclaimed by levee districts or other state agencies for a public purpose.

(7) The provisions of Paragraph (4) ratifying the effect of the reclamation of land by or on behalf of landowners prior to October 1, 1976, are remedial and shall be applied retroactively to any reclamation conducted prior to October 1, 1976, and which is in substantial compliance with the provisions of Paragraph (4).

(8) The provisions of Paragraphs (4) through (7) shall apply only to parishes with a population of more than four hundred and fifty thousand and less than four hundred and eighty thousand, according to the latest regular federal census.

* * *

Section 2. This Act shall become effective upon signature by the governor or, if not signed by the governor, upon expiration of the time for bills to become law without signature by the governor, as provided by Article III, Section 18 of the Constitution of Louisiana. If vetoed by the governor and subsequently approved by the legislature, this Act shall become effective on the day following such approval."

B.(1) The purpose of the authority shall be to oversee the funding, management, operations and projects of the Crescent City Connection Division, hereinafter referred to as "the division". Also, the authority shall recommend to the legislature the processes and methods by which the authority shall sunset or the manner in which the authority's existence shall be extended beyond December 31, 2012. In furtherance of its duties, the authority shall have access to the accounting of all expenditures, revenues, projects, status of ongoing projects of the division, and shall have the authority to review any document and other matters which relate to the division and its operations. The authority shall also recommend to the legislature methods and means to improve the operations of the division.

(2) All professional services contracts of the division shall be reviewed by the authority on an annual basis.

C. The authority shall be composed of those persons which have been previously appointed to the authority by the current governor and confirmed by the senate as of August 1, 2008. The terms of such members shall expire December 31, 2012.

D.(1) In addition to the above members, the following entities and governing authorities shall each submit a list of three names to the governor no later than August 1, 2008, the governor shall appoint one member from each list:

- (a) The governing authority of the city of New Orleans.
(b) The governing authority of Jefferson Parish.
(c) The Jefferson Business Council.
(d) Algiers Economic Development Foundation
(e) Greater New Orleans, Inc.
(f) Harvey Canal Industrial Association.
(g) Jefferson Chamber of Commerce.

(h) The Regional Planning Commission for the parishes of Orleans, Jefferson, Plaquemines, St. Bernard, and St. Tammany.

(2) These members shall serve ex-officio on the authority and shall not have the authority to vote, but shall have the authority to attend any and all meetings of the authority and make recommendations to the board on methods and means to improve the operation of the division and on the processes and methods by which the authority shall sunset or the manner in which the authority's existence shall be extended beyond December 31, 2012.

(3) The terms of these members shall also expire on December 31, 2012.

E. The authority shall meet quarterly, at a minimum, and shall report to the secretary of the Department of Transportation and Development and the Joint Legislative Committee on the Budget, twice a year and during the months of March and September.

F. The authority shall also report any findings and recommendations relative to methods and means to improve the operation of the division and on the processes and methods by which the authority shall sunset or the manner in which the authority's existence shall be extended beyond December 31, 2012, to the secretary and the joint committee as well.
