On page 1, line 3, after "distribution formula" and the semicolon ";" and before "and" insert the following:

"to exempt certain transit systems with a limited number of bus waivers from certain reporting requirements;"

AMENDMENT NO. 3

AMENDMENT NO. 4

The data shall be reported by these transit systems to the Department of Transportation and Development."
