HOUSE BILL NO. 7—

AN ACT

To enact Subpart AA of Part I of Chapter 1 of Subtitle II of Title 47 of the Louisiana Revised Statutes of 1950, to be comprised of R.S. 47:120.85, relative to state individual income tax return checkoffs for certain donations; to provide for a method for individuals to donate a portion of any refund due to them to the Louisiana Chapter of the National Multiple Sclerosis Society; to authorize and provide a method for the making of other donations to the National Multiple Sclerosis Society on the income tax return; to provide for the disposition of such donated monies; to establish the Louisiana Chapter of the National Multiple Sclerosis Society Fund as a special escrow fund in the

state treasury; to provide for the administration and use of monies in the fund; to authorize the secretary of the Department of Revenue to make certain deposits into the fund; to provide for reporting; and to provide for related matters.
