AN ACT

To amend and reenact R.S. 47:246(E) and 287.86(B)(1), relative to income tax; to authorize a net operating loss deduction carryback for corporations of five taxable years if the loss is attributable to Hurricane Isaac; and to provide for related matters.

To amend and reenact the introductory paragraph of R.S. 47:6036(B)(2), R.S. 47:6036(B)(8) and (13), (C)(1)(b) and (c), (G), and (I)(2)(a), relative to the Ports of Louisiana tax credit; to provide the term of the credit; to provide for the activities and projects to which the credit applies; to provide with respect to certain determinations and certifications; and to provide for related matters.

SENATE BILL NO. 16—

BY SENATORS LONG AND JOHNS
AN ACT

To enact R.S. 11:927(F), relative to retirement; to provide a definition of "regular retirement plan"; to provide for the optional retirement plan for higher education employees participating in the Teachers' Retirement System of Louisiana; to provide for an effective date; and to provide for related matters.

Read by title.

Reported with amendments by the Committee on Retirement.

HOUSE COMMITTEE AMENDMENTS

Amendments proposed by House Committee on Retirement to Engrossed Senate Bill No. 16 by Senator Long

AMENDMENT NO. 1

On page 1, line 2, after "retirement;" delete the remainder of the line in its entirety, and at the beginning of line 3, delete "plan";

AMENDMENT NO. 2

On page 1, delete lines 11 through 13 in their entirety, and insert the following in lieu thereof:

"F.(1) Beginning with the fiscal year in which the plan provided for in Chapter 7 of Subtitle II of Title 11 of the Louisiana Revised Statutes of 1950, hereafter referred to in this Subsection as the "cash balance plan", becomes effective and continuing every year thereafter, each postsecondary education board created by Article VIII of the Constitution of Louisiana shall adopt, as a percentage of payroll, the employer's portion to be paid to the appropriate company or companies as provided in Subsection B of this Section, which shall be the same for all employer institutions and agencies under its supervision and control. The minimum amount shall be equal to the employer's portion of the normal cost contribution that would have been contributed had the participant been a member of the cash balance plan, and the maximum amount shall be equal to the employer's portion of the normal cost contribution that would have been contributed had he been a member of Tier 1 of the regular retirement plan of the Teachers' Retirement System of Louisiana. If a postsecondary education board fails to adopt a rate by June first of any year, the employer contribution rate for each employer institution and agency under its supervision and control shall be the Tier 1 normal cost contribution of the regular retirement plan of the Teachers' Retirement System of Louisiana.

(2) The employer's contribution to the optional retirement plan for participants who are not employed by an institution or agency under the supervision and control of a higher education board created by Article VIII of the Constitution of Louisiana shall be the employer's portion of the normal cost contribution that would have been contributed had he been a member of Tier 1 of the regular retirement plan of the Teachers' Retirement System of Louisiana.

(3) For the fiscal year in which the cash balance plan becomes effective, the employer contribution, expressed as a percentage of payroll, established pursuant to this Subsection shall be reported to the Teachers' Retirement System of Louisiana no later than thirty days prior to the date on which enrollment in the cash balance plan is otherwise required for optional retirement plan participants. Annually thereafter, the employer contribution, expressed as a percentage of payroll, established pursuant to this Subsection shall be reported to the Teachers' Retirement System of Louisiana no later than June first with respect to the fiscal year that begins on the immediately following July first.

(4) This Subsection shall not alter the employer's required contribution for the amortization of the unfunded accrued liability. The total employer contribution shall be adjusted based on the amount set pursuant to Paragraph (1) of this Subsection. Following transmittal to the appropriate companies of the employer contribution set pursuant to this Subsection, the Teachers' Retirement System of Louisiana shall retain the balance of this contribution for application to the unfunded accrued liability of the system."

(12) To make available, electronically, prior to convening each day an order of the day for the House which shall consist of a listing of the regular and special orders of business of the House for that day; an enumeration of each legislative instrument to be acted upon that day in each such order of business; an enumeration of all legislative instruments for which a notice of intention to call from the calendar has been given in accordance with House Rule 8.26; and an enumeration of all legislative instruments which have been returned to the calendar. ~~The order of the day shall also enumerate those instruments on third reading and final passage which are on the major state calendar and those which are on the local and consent calendar.~~ No hard copies of the order of the day shall be distributed to a member unless the member specifically requests a hard copy.

A. For each meeting held during session at which a legislative instrument is scheduled for public hearing, a standing committee shall submit a written report to the Clerk of the House as soon as possible after each committee meeting. For each meeting held during the interim at which a legislative instrument is scheduled for public hearing and a report on such instrument is determined, each standing committee shall submit a written report to the Clerk of the House within five working days after the committee meeting. The report of such standing committee for each meeting shall be in such form as to list in numerical order the number and title of each legislative instrument upon which the committee took action at the meeting. Below the designation and title of each legislative instrument the report of the committee shall contain the following with respect to such instrument:

~~(3) In each case in which a bill or joint resolution is reported favorably or reported with amendments, after the vote by which such report was determined, in parentheses, the words "local and consent calendar", if, upon a separate motion, the committee has recommended that the instrument be placed on the local and consent calendar as provided in House Rule 8.21, or the words "major state calendar", if, upon a separate motion, the committee has recommended that the instrument be placed on the major state calendar as provided in House Rule 8.22, or, the words "regular calendar", for a bill or a joint resolution which is not placed on the local and consent calendar or on the major state calendar.~~

(4) For each instrument reported with amendments, the proposed amendments, submitted on a separate sheet of paper and

numbered consecutively and the original and three copies thereof attached to the bill.

~~(5)~~ (4) In each case in which the committee has recommended that the bill or joint resolution be placed in Special Order, in parentheses the words "Special Order" ~~after the words "local and consent calendar", "regular calendar", or "major state calendar"~~, if, upon a separate motion, the committee has recommended that the bill or joint resolution be placed in Special Order as provided in House Rule 8.6.

The failure of the committee to adopt any enumerated report shall not imply the adoption of the negative report or any other report, which to be adopted shall be directly put to and adopted by the committee.

(2) Notwithstanding the provisions of Subparagraph (1) of this Paragraph, no legislative instrument that requires a vote of at least two-thirds of the elected members for final passage shall be reported by a committee unless one of the reports enumerated in House Rule 6.11(A)(1) shall have been affirmatively adopted by at least a majority of the members appointed to the committee.

C. The provisions of this Rule shall not apply to any member of the legislature nor to any legislative employee subject to the provisions of House Rule 3.4.

The legislature further finds that state statutes mandating payment by the city of New Orleans to the state's employees and officers of the Clerk for the Criminal District Court for the parish of Orleans constitute a valid exercise of state's police power, and such statutes do not violate the provisions of the Louisiana Constitution of 1921 or the Louisiana Constitution of 1974.

Section 4. The provisions of this Act shall become effective upon approval of the Judicial Council."
