(b) The board may increase the fee one time during each subsequent calendar year not to exceed ten percent of the amount of the fee imposed during the previous calendar year; however, the amount of the fee shall not exceed the maximum amount authorized in Subparagraph (a) of this Paragraph.

(c) No fee may be imposed or increased pursuant to the provisions of this Subsection unless the question of its imposition and the board's authority to increase the fee has been approved by a majority of the registered voters of the district who vote on the proposition at an election held for that purpose in accordance with the Louisiana Election Code.

(d) If approved, the fee and the board's authority to increase the fee shall expire in ten years, but the fee and board's authority to increase the fee may be renewed if approved by a majority of the registered voters of the district voting on the proposition at an election as provided in Subparagraph (c) of this Paragraph. If the fee and board's authority to increase the fee is renewed, the term of the imposition of the fee shall be as provided in the proposition authorizing such renewal, not to exceed ten years."
