To amend and reenact R.S. 17:3139.2(2)(a) and (4)(a) and 3139.6(1), relative to performance agreements between the Board of Regents and certain public postsecondary education institutions; to provide relative to the terms of such agreements with respect to remedial courses and developmental study programs offered at certain historically black colleges and universities; to provide relative to required reporting by the Board of Regents; and to provide for related matters.

(1) The Board of Regents annually shall monitor and report to the legislature and the governor on each participating institution's progress in meeting the established targets for performance objectives as specified in R.S. 17:3139.2 and the effect of the exemptions as provided in R.S. 17:3139.2(2)(a) and (4)(a) relative to the adoption of admission standards and the elimination of remedial education course offerings and developmental study programs at certain institutions. At the end of the first six years and each subsequent six-year period, the Board of Regents shall determine whether to recommend renewal of an institution's performance agreement subject to the approval of the Joint Legislative Committee on the Budget. Such determination shall be based on the

recommendations of a review panel established by the Board of Regents to conduct a comprehensive review and evaluation of the institution's progress in meeting the performance objectives. The composition of the review panel shall be the same as is provided in R.S. 17:3138(C) with the addition of two representatives from the business community, who each possess a postsecondary degree, one recommended by the speaker of the House of Representatives and one recommended by the president of the Senate.

I. SUMMARY OF JOINT RESOLUTION

This report is for House Bill No. 61 of the 2015 Regular Session by Representative Carmody, proposing to amend Art. VIII, Section 5(E), and to add Article VII, Section 2.1(C) of the Constitution.

HB 61 proposes to exempt public postsecondary education tuition and fees from the requirements for imposing a new fee or increasing an existing fee

II. CONCLUSION

The proposed measure cannot be accomplished statutorily.

HB 61 proposes to exempt tuition or fees charged by public postsecondary education institutions from certain provisions of the constitution. A constitutional amendment would be required to create an exemption from these requirements. HB 61 also creates an exception allowing tuition and fees charged to students attending public postsecondary education institutions to be provided by law.

I. SUMMARY OF JOINT RESOLUTION

This report is for House Bill No. 412 of the 2015 Regular Session by Representative Jay Morris, proposing to amend Art. VII, Section 2.2 and to add Art. VII, Sections 10(F)(4)(h) and 10.15 of the Constitution.

HB 412 proposes to dedicate the avails of the existing one percent state sales and use tax for the support of public elementary through post-secondary education.

II. CONCLUSION

The proposed measure can be accomplished statutorily.

HB 412 proposes to revive a portion of the two percent sales and use tax on food, residential utilities, and prescription drugs which previously existed in the constitution, but which was phased out on July 1, 2003.

HB 412 also establishes the Stability in Education Fund. The Fund could be established by law, and therefore does not require a constitutional amendment.

Other than to provide constitutional protection to the dedication of these funds, this measure could be accomplished statutorily.
