resources; to authorize the legislature to levy a tax on the use of hydrocarbon processing facilities; to provide for repeal of certain severance taxes; and to specify an election for submission of the proposition to electors and provide a ballot proposition.

AN ACT

To amend and reenact R.S. 47:301.1(A)(introductory paragraph), 302(C)(2) and 331(C), relative to state sales and use tax; to provide for the tax on telecommunications services; to establish the tax rate; to provide for effectiveness; and to provide for related matters.

AN ACT To amend and reenact R.S. 47:32(A), 79, 293(10), and 295(B) and to repeal R.S. 47:293(3) and (9)(a)(xi) and 294, relative to the individual income tax; to provide for the calculation of individual income tax liability; to provide for the rates and brackets on individual income tax; to provide for certain deductions and credits; to reduce certain deductions and credits; to repeal the deduction for excess federal itemized personal deductions; to provide for effectiveness; and to provide for related matters.
