**I. SUMMARY OF JOINT RESOLUTION**

This report is for House Bill No. 459 of the 2016 Regular Session by Representative Danahay, proposing to amend HB 459 proposes to amend the constitution to provide that the manner of appointment and qualifications of the registrar of voters are to be provided by law.

**II. CONCLUSION**

The proposed measure cannot be accomplished statutorily.

HB 459 proposes to amend the constitution to provide that the manner of appointment and qualifications of the registrar of voters are to be provided by law The present constitution and law are silent as to the manner of appointment and qualifications of the registrar. A constitutional amendment is necessary to require the legislature to enact laws to provide for the manner of appointment and qualifications of the registrar and to avoid a conflict of authority between the legislature and the local governing authority.

**RULE 6.8(A) REPORT

**I. SUMMARY OF JOINT RESOLUTION**

This report is for House Bill No. 505 of the 2016 Regular Session by Representative Mike Johnson, proposing to add Article VII, Section 21 of the Constitution.

HB 505 proposes to amend the constitution to allow an exemption from ad valorem property tax for the total assessed value of the homestead of an unmarried surviving spouse of a person who died while on active duty as a member of the armed forces of the United States or the Louisiana National Guard, or while performing duties as a state police, law enforcement, or fire protection officer.

**II. CONCLUSION**

The proposed measure cannot be accomplished statutorily.

HB 505 proposes to amend the constitution to allow an exemption from ad valorem property tax for the total assessed value of the homestead for certain persons. The present constitution Article VII, Section 21, provides for certain exemptions in addition to the homestead exemption. By amending Article VII, Section 21, an additional exemption would be created.
