this Paragraph. Notwithstanding the foregoing, an ad valorem taxing authority may negotiate and enter into a cooperative endeavor agreement with a property owner for a payment in lieu of ad valorem taxes during the first two years of a contract of exemption allowed by Paragraph (F) of this Section as provided by law.

(4) The terms "manufacturing establishment" and "addition" shall have the same meanings ascribed to them in Paragraph (F) of this Section."

(4) A public hearing shall be conducted by any taxing authority prior to adoption of any resolution approving a cooperative endeavor agreement. Notice of such hearing and the proposed resolution shall be published in the official journal of the applicable taxing authority at least once, no later than fourteen days prior to the hearing, or if there is no official journal, in a newspaper having general circulation

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therein. The notice shall inform the public where a copy of the draft cooperative endeavor agreement may be obtained and the time and place of the hearing.

(5) Prior to any public hearing by any taxing authority and approval of a cooperative endeavor agreement, the assessor for the parish where the property is located shall be consulted in connection with the negotiation of the terms of the cooperative endeavor agreement.

(6) Such cooperative endeavor agreement shall only apply to those taxing authorities who are parties thereto, and any non-participating taxing authority shall not be bound thereby and their ad valorem taxes shall continue to be billed and collected without regard to the provisions of this Section."

These jobs shall be in excess of the number of jobs that existed in Louisiana because of that property owner and all affiliated companies prior to the effective date of the cooperative endeavor agreement."

A. Personal Exemption. An exemption of one thousand dollars shall be allowed for the taxpayer who is blind or who has sustained the loss of one or more limbs or who has an intellectual disability or who is deaf. As used in this Section, the term "blind" shall mean and refer to a person who, after examination by a licensed physician skilled in diseases of the eye or by a licensed optometrist, has been determined to have not more than 20/200 central visual acuity in the better eye with correcting lenses, or an equally disabling loss of the visual field as evidenced by a limitation to the field of vision in the better eye to such a degree that its widest diameter subtends an angle of no greater than twenty degrees. The term "deaf" shall be defined as in Subsection B of this Section. Each person claiming an exemption under the provisions of this Section shall be able to prove a claim by certificate of a qualified physician or optometrist.

B. Deductions for dependents. (1) A deduction of one thousand dollars shall be allowed for each dependent allowed, in determining federal income tax liability, who is blind or deaf or who has sustained the loss of one or more limbs or who has an intellectual disability. For purposes of this Section, the word "deaf" shall mean and refer to persons whose hearing is so impaired that it is insufficient for use in an occupation or activity for which hearing is essential. The term "blind" shall be defined as in Subsection A of this Section. The taxpayer claiming the deduction authorized in this Subsection shall be able to prove a claim by certificate of a qualified physician or optometrist issued for each dependent for which a deduction is claimed.

(2) In addition to the deduction authorized in Paragraph (1) of this Subsection, an additional deduction of one thousand dollars shall be allowed for each dependent as allowed in determining federal income tax liability.

C. Limitation on portion of deduction allowable. There shall be allowed only that portion of the deductions set forth in this Section which the net income of the individual taxable under this Chapter bears to the total net income of the individual."
