(10) "Tax table income", for nonresident individuals, means the amount of Louisiana income, as provided in this Part, allocated and apportioned under the provisions of R.S. 47:241 through 247, plus the total amount of the personal exemptions and deductions already included in the tax tables promulgated by the secretary under authority of R.S. 47:295, less the proportionate amount of the federal income tax liability, excess federal itemized personal deductions, the temporary teacher deduction, the recreation volunteer and volunteer firefighter deduction, the construction code retrofitting deduction, any gratuitous grant, loan, or other benefit directly or indirectly provided to a taxpayer by a hurricane recovery entity if such benefit was included in federal adjusted gross income, the exclusion provided for in R.S. 47:297.3 for S Bank shareholders, the deduction for expenses disallowed by I.R.C. Section 280C, the deduction for net capital gains, Louisiana state income tax refunds which are included in federal adjusted gross income, and personal exemptions and deductions provided for in R.S. 47:294. The proportionate amount is to be determined by the ratio of Louisiana income to federal adjusted gross income. When federal adjusted gross income is less than Louisiana income, the ratio shall be one hundred percent.

§294. Filing status; personal ~~Personal~~ exemptions; and credit for dependents

~~All personal exemptions and deductions for dependents allowed in determining federal income tax liability, including the extra exemption for the blind and aged, will be allowed in determining the tax liability in this Part. Taxpayers are required to use the same filing status and claim the same exemptions on their return required to be filed under this Part as they used on their federal income tax return. ~~B. An additional deduction of one thousand dollars shall be allowed for each allowable exemption in excess of those required to qualify for the exemption allowable under R.S. 47:294(A).~~

A. Personal Exemption. An exemption of one thousand dollars shall be allowed for the taxpayer who is blind or who has sustained the loss of one or more limbs or who has an intellectual disability or who is deaf. As used in this Section, the term "blind" shall mean and refer to a person who, after examination by a licensed physician skilled in diseases of the eye or by a licensed optometrist, has been determined to have not more than 20/200 central visual acuity in the better eye with correcting lenses, or an equally disabling loss of the visual field as evidenced by a limitation to the field of vision in the better eye to such a degree that its widest diameter subtends an angle of no greater than twenty degrees. The term "deaf" shall be defined as in Subsection B of this Section. Each person claiming an exemption under the provisions of this Section shall be able to prove a claim by certificate of a qualified physician or optometrist.

B. Deductions for dependents. (1) A deduction of one thousand dollars shall be allowed for each dependent allowed, in determining federal income tax liability, who is blind or deaf or who has sustained the loss of one or more limbs or who has an intellectual disability. For purposes of this Section, the word "deaf" shall mean and refer to persons whose hearing is so impaired that it is insufficient for use in an occupation or activity for which hearing is essential. The term "blind" shall be defined as in Subsection A of this Section. The taxpayer claiming the deduction authorized in this Subsection shall be able to prove a claim by certificate of a qualified physician or optometrist issued for each dependent for which a deduction is claimed.

(2) In addition to the deduction authorized in Paragraph (1) of this Subsection, an additional deduction of one thousand dollars shall be allowed for each dependent as allowed in determining federal income tax liability.

C. Limitation on portion of deduction allowable. There shall be allowed only that portion of the deductions set forth in this Section which the net income of the individual taxable under this Chapter bears to the total net income of the individual."

A. Definition. "Louisiana taxable income" of a resident estate or trust means the taxable income of the estate or trust determined in accordance with federal law for the same taxable year, as specifically modified by the provisions contained in Subsection B of this Section, less a federal income tax deduction to be computed following the provisions of R.S. 47:287.83 and 287.85 in accordance with the following provisions:

(1) In computing Louisiana taxable income, no federal income tax deduction shall be allowed on net income upon which no Louisiana income tax has been incurred, or upon which, for any reason whatsoever, no Louisiana income tax will be paid. For purposes of this Section, the federal income tax deduction may be recomputed and reduced to reflect the application of a net operating loss adjustment. When computing Louisiana taxable income, the secretary may consider reductions to the federal income tax deduction in accordance with the provisions of this Paragraph.

(2) The alternative minimum tax is a federal income tax deductible to the extent that it is applicable to regular federal taxable income. Any alternative minimum tax paid on tax preference items shall not be deductible. In accordance with the provisions of this Paragraph, the secretary may determine the deductible portion of the alternative minimum tax.

(3) For purposes of this Section, federal income taxes shall include taxes based on net income, accumulated earnings, war profits, excess profits, personal holding company income, and tax from recomputation of investment credit. The amount of the federal income tax deduction shall be that portion of the total federal income tax, after application of all credits, which is levied on income derived solely from sources in this state as computed under rules and regulations prescribed by the secretary. For purposes of federal income taxation as compared to the computation of net income under this Part, proper adjustment shall be made for the actual tax rates as applied to different classes of income and for all differences in the computation of net income.

(4) As used in this Subsection, the term "credits" shall not include overpayments of prior year taxes allowed as a credit, estimated tax payments or similar prepayments, credit for prior year alternative minimum tax that is allowed as a credit against the current regular federal income tax, or federal income tax credits determined by the secretary to be presidential disaster area disaster relief credits.

PART V. STATE-LEVEL COLLABORATION TO IMPROVE PUBLIC DRINKING WATER QUALITY

§1290.1. Legislative findings; purpose

A. The Legislature of Louisiana does hereby find and declare the following:

(1) The provision of water for public use and consumption not only safe but also acceptable in appearance, taste, and odor is of the highest priority.

(2) Water aesthetically unacceptable can undermine the confidence of consumers, will lead to complaints, and could lead to the use of water from sources which are less safe.

(3) Generally, consumers have no means of judging the safety of their water themselves, but their attitude towards the water supply and water suppliers is often greatly affected by the aspects of water quality they are able to perceive with their own senses.

(4) It is natural for consumers to regard with suspicion water that appears dirty or discolored or that has an unpleasant taste or smell. Even though these characteristics may not in themselves be of direct consequence, they may consequently cause a substantial number of persons to discontinue using a public water system.

(5) On July 28, 2010, through Resolution 64/292, the United Nations General Assembly explicitly recognized the right to safe and clean drinking water and sanitation as a human right that is essential for the full enjoyment of life and all human rights.

(6) In November 2002, the United Nations Committee on Economic, Social, and Cultural Rights adopted General Comment No. 15, The Right to Water, which states the human right to water is indispensable for leading a life in human dignity and is a prerequisite for the realization of other human rights.

B. The purpose of this Part is to request the Louisiana Department of Health to lead a collaborative effort to improve public drinking water quality in this state, and to develop recommendations to the legislature concerning effective and responsible practices to improve and maintain the quality of drinking water provided by water utility systems.

§1290.2. State-level collaboration to improve public drinking water quality

A. The Louisiana Department of Health shall lead a collaborative effort to evaluate the issues and conditions of drinking water treatment and distribution in communities throughout Louisiana by performing a thorough evaluation of all of the following:

(1) The sanitary survey results for each water utility system across Louisiana.

(2) The effects deteriorating systems have on the safety, health, and well-being of Louisiana families, communities, and businesses.

B. The Louisiana Department of Health shall engage and solicit, as necessary, input, recommendations, and guidance from interested parties and stakeholders including but not limited to any of the following:

(1) State and local agencies involved in the regulation, treatment, and distribution of drinking water.

(2) Technical experts at the university and consulting levels.

(3) Water utility system owners and operators, community members, and state legislators from areas with known public water quality issues.

§1290.3. Reporting

A. The Louisiana Department of Health shall develop a report of the results of the collaborative effort required by this Part, including findings, recommendations, and proposed legislation, if necessary, and shall submit the report to the House and Senate committees on health and welfare no later than thirty days prior to the convening of the 2020 Regular Legislative Session.

B. The Louisiana Department of Health shall submit an interim progress report no later than thirty days prior to the convening of the regular legislative session of each year until the final report required by Subsection A of this Section is submitted.

§1290.4. Termination

The provisions of this Part shall terminate on December 31, 2020."
