(1) The treasurer shall send written notice informing the company that it has been identified as a company that boycotts Israel and that it may become subject to divestment by the treasurer's office.

(2) The treasurer shall provide an opportunity for the company to comment in writing.

D. If after receiving notice as provided for in Subsection C of this Section, the company demonstrates that it has not engaged in a commerce-related or investment-related boycott, divestment, or sanctions activity targeting Israel, the treasurer shall not include the company on the list for that year.

E. If after receiving notice as provided for in Subsection C of this Section, the company fails to make a demonstration that it has not engaged in a commerce-related or investment-related boycott, divestment, or sanctions activity targeting Israel, the company may be included on the list of prohibited investments no sooner than ninety days following the date on which written notice was sent to the company as provided in Subsection C of this Section.

F. If a company is included on the list of prohibited investments because the company has engaged in a commerce-related or investment-related boycott, divestment, or sanctions activity targeting Israel and ceases the activity that caused the company to be included on the prohibited investments list and the company provides sufficient documentation to the treasurer indicating that the company has ceased the activity, the treasurer shall remove the company from the list of prohibited investments."

(a) There is an available program in the local jurisdiction that has sufficient experience in working with criminal justice participants with substance abuse disorders and is certified and approved by the state of Louisiana.

(b) The cost of the approved treatment does not create a substantial financial hardship to the defendant or his dependents. For purposes of this determination, "substantial financial hardship" shall have the same meaning as provided in R.S. 15:175.

(4) If the offender does not successfully complete the drug treatment program, or otherwise violates the conditions of his probation, the court may revoke the probation or impose other sanctions pursuant to Code of Criminal Procedure Article 900."

(d) An owner may exclude a named person as an insured under a commercial policy if the owner obtains and maintains in force another policy of motor vehicle insurance which provides coverage for the person so excluded which is equal to that coverage provided in the policy for which the person was excluded. The alternative coverage is required for both primary and excess insurance.

Section 3.(A) The provisions of Section 2 shall become effective July 1, 2018, upon policy issuance or policy renewal.

(B) The provisions of Section 1 and this Section shall become effective August 1, 2017."
