AMENDMENT NO. 1

On page 2, delete lines 1 through 6 in their entirety and insert the following:

"C.(1) The Department of Public Safety and Corrections, office of state police, may initiate an administrative action to suspend the storage license pursuant to the provisions of this Chapter for either of the following:

(a) Repeat violations of any provision of this Chapter.

(b) The failure to meet requirements for the issuance of a storage license.

(2) Except as otherwise provided for in R.S. 49:961(C), no suspension imposed pursuant to the provisions of this Chapter shall exceed thirty days.

(3) Revocation may be issued for three or more suspensions.

(4) Prior to the suspension or revocation of any license, the licensee will have the opportunity for an impartial hearing held in accordance with the Administrative Procedure Act.

(5) For purposes of this Subsection, "repeat violations" means three or more violations of the same administrative rule or regulation within a two-year period."

House Bill No. 113 of the 2019 Regular Session by Representative Leger, proposes to enact Article IV, Section 3(E) of the Constitution of Louisiana.

HB 113 proposes to require that the governor and lieutenant governor are elected jointly.

II. PROPOSED ELECTION DATE

The proposed election date at which the proposition is to be submitted to the voters is October 12, 2019, which should ensure maximum voter turnout, to the extent practicable.

IV. CONSTITUTIONAL NECESSITY

I. SUMMARY OF JOINT RESOLUTION

This report is for House Bill No. 428 of the 2019 Regular Session by Representative Dwight, proposing to amend Article VII, Section 3(A) and to add Article V, Section 35 of the Constitution.

HB 428 continues the existing Board of Tax Appeals within Article V of the constitution, extends the jurisdiction to all matters of taxes and fees, and extends the remedy for recovery to include unconstitutional taxes paid by a taxpayer.

II. CONCLUSION

Certain provisions of this proposed measure may be accomplished statutorily.

HB 428 proposes to continue the Board of Tax Appeals within Article V of the Louisiana Constitution. The Board of Tax Appeals

is currently established by statute in R.S. 47:1401. The joint resolution also extends the board's jurisdiction to all matters related to state and local taxes and fees, and extends the remedy for recovery to include unconstitutional taxes paid by a taxpayer. Since this proposed provision appears to extend the jurisdiction of the Board of Tax Appeals to all matters related to state and local taxes and fees, a constitutional amendment may be necessary to avoid conflicts with existing courts established by Article V of the Louisiana Constitution.
