**Senate Bills and Joint Resolutions

BY SENATORS LUNEAU AND ROBERT MILLS
AN ACT**

To enact R.S. 22:1482(D) and 1482.1(C), relative to rating standards and methods; to prohibit the determination of rate classifications based on the deployment of the insured in the military for at least six months; and to provide for related matters.

SENATE BILL NO. 191—

AN ACT

To enact R.S. 44:4(59) and 22.2, relative to public records; to provide for contracts with the Department of Economic Development; to provide for confidentiality of certain information submitted pursuant to a contract with the Department of Economic Development; to provide for terms, definitions, and conditions; and to provide for related matters.

SENATE BILL NO. 273—

To enact R.S. 44:4.1(D) and Chapter 31-A of Title 51 of the Louisiana Revised Statutes of 1950, to be comprised of R.S. 51:2111 through 2116, relative to registration with the secretary of state by managed service providers and managed security service providers servicing public bodies; to provide requirements for doing business; to provide for definitions; to provide for exceptions to public records law; to provide for time limitations on the reporting of cyber incidents; and to provide for related matters.

SENATE BILL NO. 354—

AN ACT

To amend and reenact R.S. 15:827.1(B)(6), relative to photo identification of offenders released from incarceration; to provide relative to the issuance of a photo identification card to offenders prior to release; to require certain information to be included on the identification card; and to provide for related matters.

SENATE BILL NO. 390—
BY SENATOR PETERSON

AN ACT

To amend and reenact R.S. 33:4071(A)(1)(e), 4084(A)(1)(b) and (2) and (E), 4085(A) and (B), and 4090, and to enact R.S. 33:4084(A)(1)(c), relative to the Sewerage and Water Board of New Orleans; to provide relative to the board; to provide for the purchase of supplies and machinery and equipment; to provide for the letting and bidding of public contracts over a certain amount; to provide relative to the costs of the installation of connections and subsequent work; to provide for reports of board; to provide relative to exemptions related to the Orleans Parish School Board; and to provide for related matters.

Under the rules, the above bill was referred to the Committee on Municipal, Parochial and Cultural Affairs.

SENATE BILL NO. 422—

AN ACT

To amend and reenact R.S. 18:573(A)(3) and 1313(J)(2)(b) and (3), relative to the reinspection of voting machines and recounting of absentee by mail and early voting ballots; to provide for setting the timing of inspections; to provide for deadlines for requests for inspections; and to provide for related matters.

Under the rules, the above bill was referred to the Committee on House and Governmental Affairs.

SENATE BILL NO. 435—
BY SENATORS ABRAHAM AND FOIL

AN ACT

To amend and reenact R.S. 29:735(A)(1), and to enact R.S. 29:773, relative to immunity from civil liability; to provide relative to certain immunity by public entities and persons from civil liability during disasters and emergencies; to provide relative to the Louisiana Homeland Security and Emergency Assistance and Disaster Act; to provide relative to limitation of liability during the COVID-19 public health emergency; to provide certain terms and conditions; and to provide for related matters.

AN ACT

To amend and reenact Code of Criminal Procedure Art. 320(G), (H), (I)(1)(a), and (J), and Art. 321(C)(5) and (6), R.S. 14:79(A)(3)(c) and (E), R.S. 15:574.4.2(A)(5), R.S. 46:1846(A) and (C) and 2132(4), to enact Code of Criminal Procedure Art. 320(L) and R.S. 15:574.2(A)(6), relative to protective orders; provides for domestic offenses, stalking, and sex offenses; provides for uniform abuse prevention orders; provides for types of bail; provides for violation of protective orders; provides for decisions of committee on parole; prohibits communication between offender and victim; provides for exceptions; makes technical corrections; and to provide for related matters.

HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 66—

BY REPRESENTATIVE BISHOP

To suspend until sixty days after final adjournment of the 2021 Regular Session of the Legislature of Louisiana the state corporation franchise tax levied on domestic and foreign corporations at the rate of one dollar and fifty cents for each one thousand dollars, or major fraction thereof on the first three hundred thousand dollars of taxable capital pursuant to the provisions of R.S. 47:601(A) and to suspend the initial tax levied on corporations or other entities for the first accounting period in which the entity becomes subject to the corporation franchise tax pursuant to the provisions of R.S. 47:611(A).

"WHEREAS, Senators Cassidy and Menendez plan to expand eligibility for CARES Act aid with the SMART Fund to include parishes and municipalities with populations of fifty thousand people or more, which would increase direct participation and aid access to parishes and municipalities that are currently excluded by the five hundred thousand person population threshold in the CARES Act; and

WHEREAS, the SMART Fund legislation would also ensure that every eligible entity receives additional funding, increase flexibility for states and local governments to use the funds to replace revenue losses due to the COVID-19 outbreak, and target additional funding toward coronavirus hot zones to"

AMENDMENT NO. 3

On page 2, line 1, after "Fund" and before "for an" change "calls" to "would call"

AMENDMENT NO. 4

On page 2, line 3, between "funds" and "be used" change "can" to "could"

HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 71—
BY REPRESENTATIVE SCHEXNAYDER

A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

To authorize and direct state agencies and licensing boards to adopt emergency rules suspending fees that are imposed on businesses until the final adjournment of the 2021 Regular Session of the Legislature of Louisiana.

Read by title.

Reported favorably by the Committee on Commerce.

On motion of Rep. Davis, the resolution was ordered engrossed and passed to its third reading.

HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 74—
BY REPRESENTATIVE SCHEXNAYDER

A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

To urge and request the state of Louisiana through the Louisiana Department of Health, or any other state agency as may be deemed appropriate, to provide funding from the CARES Act, P.L.116-136, or any additional federal funding to Louisiana private healthcare systems for COVID-19 testing and to report the proposed distribution to the legislature by June 1, 2020.

Read by title.

Reported with amendments by the Committee on Appropriations.

HOUSE COMMITTEE AMENDMENTS

Amendments proposed by House Committee on Appropriations to Original House Concurrent Resolution No. 74 by Representative Schexnayder

AMENDMENT NO. 1

On page 1, line 3, after "appropriate," delete the remainder of the line, delete lines 4 through 13 in their entirety and insert the following:

"to provide funding from the CARES Act, P.L.116-136, or any additional federal funding to Louisiana private healthcare systems for COVID-19 testing and to report the proposed distribution to the legislature by June 1, 2020.

WHEREAS, the United States Congress and the president of the United States are providing support to healthcare providers fighting the COVID-19 pandemic through CARES Act funding and the various programs the act created; and

WHEREAS, such funding will be used to support healthcare-related expenses or lost revenue in healthcare systems attributable to COVID-19; and"

AMENDMENT NO. 2

On page 1, delete lines 17 through 21 in their entirety and on page 2, delete lines 1 through 10 in their entirety and insert the following:

"WHEREAS, increased access to COVID-19 testing and COVID-19 antibody testing is vital to protect the public health and safety of the Louisiana people; and

WHEREAS, funding provided through the CARES Act is intended to help health systems across America continue to battle

COVID-19 and expand capacity for the vital functions of testing, contact tracing, and containment.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Legislature of Louisiana does hereby urge and request the state of Louisiana through the Louisiana Department of Health, or any other state agency as may be deemed appropriate, to use funding provided to Louisiana by the CARES Act, P.L. 116-136, including but not limited to a portion of the approximately one billion eight hundred million dollars received through the Coronavirus Relief Fund, or any additional federal funding to support Louisiana's private sector health care systems as they seek to establish a robust COVID-19 testing infrastructure.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that on or before June 1, 2020, the Louisiana Department of Health, shall report the proposed distribution of funding called for in this Resolution to the House Committee on Appropriations, the Senate Committee on Finance, the House Committee on Health and Welfare, the Senate Committee on Health and Welfare, and the David R. Poynter Legislative Research Library."

AMENDMENT NO. 3

On page 2, lines 3 and 7, after "periods," and before "and" insert "lien periods,"

AMENDMENT NO. 4

On page 2, between lines 24 and 25, insert the following:

"(10) Titles 38 and 48 and all other Codes and Titles of the Louisiana Revised Statutes of 1950.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the suspension by this Resolution of prescriptive periods, lien periods, preemptive periods, and all legal deadlines is limited to the time period of March 16, 2020, through September 30, 2020, and the suspension is further limited and shall apply only if the prescriptive period, lien period, preemptive period, or legal deadline would have otherwise lapsed.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this limited suspension shall terminate on September 30, 2020, and any right, claim, or action which would have expired during the time period of March 16, 2020, through September 30, 2020, shall lapse on October 1, 2020.

(3) "New jobs" shall mean employment with a COVID-19-impacted business where each employee satisfies all of the following criteria:

(a) The employee is employed by the COVID-19-impacted business at its place of operation.

(b) The employee is a Louisiana resident.

(c) The employee's hire or rehire date is on or after May 15, 2020.

(d) The employee is paid, as a base wage, at least the federal minimum wage excluding tips, bonuses, and commissions.

B. There is hereby established a rebate for any eligible COVID-19-impacted business that meets the requirements of this Section. The amount of the rebate shall be based on the benefit rate for each new job. In order to qualify for the rebate, the COVID-19-impacted business shall create a minimum of five new jobs between May 15, 2020, and December 31, 2021, and shall create a minimum new annual payroll from new jobs of at least forty thousand dollars before December 31, 2021. In order to determine the number of new jobs eligible for the rebate established pursuant to the provisions of this Section, the applicant's employment baseline shall be the total number of active full-time and part-time employees at the COVID-19-impacted business's place of operation that are Louisiana residents on May 14, 2020. The term of COVID-19-impacted business contracts shall not exceed a term of five-years."

House Bill No. 465 of the 2020 Regular Session by Representative Ivey, proposes to add Article VII, Section 9.1 of the Constitution of Louisiana.

Requires enactment of a law by 2/3 of the elected members of each house of the legislature to create a special fund in the state treasury, to increase or decrease the amount of monies dedicated to a special fund, or to modify the purposes for which monies in a special fund may be used or requirements for using monies.

II. CONSTITUTIONAL NECESSITY

The proposed measure cannot be accomplished statutorily.

III. PROPOSED ELECTION DATE

The proposed election date at which the proposition is to be submitted to the voters is November 3, 2020, which should ensure maximum voter turnout, to the extent practicable.
