The manufacturer, distributor, wholesaler, factory branch, or distributor branch shall have forty-five days from receiving the additional repair orders to rebut the presumption in accordance with the provisions of this Paragraph, provided that any rebuttal utilizing the additional repair orders shall conform to the requirements of Paragraphs (4), (5), and (8) of this Subsection.

- (c) The manufacturer, distributor, wholesaler, factory branch, or distributor branch may rebut the presumption by showing all of the following:
- (i) By reasonably substantiating that the submission is materially inaccurate and by providing a full explanation of any and all reasons.
